PARTIII-LINE 29 - STROKE CAMPS-In 2016, FORUran three stroke camps in March, May, and December. The September camp had to be
canceled due to an increase incidence of the Zika virusin the area. The structure of the camps was changed from five to seven full days of
intensive neurological rehabilitations patients work to improve their gait, balance and arm/hand function. This change allowed the
implementation of home visits and community outings with patients which helped to increase their function in the community. Pre/post
testing was done in the first and last days of the camp to measure functional changes in the areas addressed. Fifty-one US/Jamaican
volunteer physical therapist and physical therapystudents from six different universities participated in the camps. A total of twenty-three
patients were served, all of which made dramatic gains in their functional mobility. This programs erves to further FORU's exempt purposes
