

Below are the three activities related to the priorities identified in Gradys 2016 CHNA. 1 Improve coordination of care for Grady patients with diabetes, hypertension, prostate cancer, HIV/AIDS and behavioral health conditions. Grady was a lead partner in establishing a statewide Community Health Worker Convention with the purpose of creating a common understanding among stakeholders on the definition, roles and value of community health workers (CHW), and fostering alignment of CHW efforts in supporting health improvement and healthcare access in Georgia. Grady continued to lead in community collaboration through the Atlanta Regional Collaborative for Health Improvement (ARCHI) Grady has representation on the Steering Committee and has participated in community-wide care coordination planning and implementation for ARCHIs Tri-Cities Pilot Project. Grady has met with the Tri-Cities community through this project to address barriers to access for care. In 2016, ARCHI launched an effort to address a common CHNA priority, diabetes, among several healthcare providers in ARCHI. 




