# AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF THE

# JAMES W. AND FRANCES GIBSON McGLOTHLIN FOUNDATION A VIRGINIA NONSTOCK CORPORATION

### ARTICLE I

- 1.1 <u>Name</u>. The name of the Corporation shall be the James W. and Frances Gibson McGlothlin Foundation (the "Corporation").
- 1.2 <u>Corporate Offices</u>. The principal office of the Corporation shall be located at 1005 Glenway Avenue, Bristol, Virginia.
- 1.3 <u>Purpose</u>. The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are (i) to engage in charitable, educational and other non-profit activities of an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and (ii) to make grants to organizations for purposes described in Section 170(c)(2)(B) of the Code.

# ARTICLE II BOARD OF DIRECTORS

2.1 <u>General Powers</u>. The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be conducted under the direction of, and the control and disposal of the Corporation's assets shall be vested in, its Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided in the nonprofit Corporation law of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws.

The Board of Directors shall have the authority to hold and invest the assets of the Corporation in accordance with the provisions of Virginia law.

2.2 Number, Classes, Term, and Qualifications. The Board of Directors shall consist of no more than eight (8) Directors. Of the eight (8) Directors, five (5) shall be Affiliated Directors, one (1) shall be a Family Director, and three (3) shall be Independent Directors. The number of Directors shall be set from time to time by resolution of the Directors. Directors shall be twenty-one (21) years of age or older. There shall be three classes of Directors: "Affiliated Directors," Family Directors and Independent Directors." Affiliated and Family Directors shall be appointed to serve one (1) year terms and shall be eligible for re-appointment without restrictions. Independent Directors shall be appointed to serve an initial one (1) year term and may be reappointed for no more than seven (7) successive additional one (1) year terms. Each Director shall hold office until his or her successor is elected and qualified, or until his or her earlier death, resignation, or removal.

The term Afiliated Director shall be defined as any person who is a shareholder, officer, employee, or former employee of The United Company or any of its subsidiaries or related entities.

The term Family Director shall be defined as any person who is a lineal descendant of the sole incorporator.

The term Independent Director shall be defined as any person who is not affiliated, directly or indirectly, with The United Company or any of its subsidiaries or related entities.

2,3 <u>Nomination and Election of Directors</u>. Recommendations for Director nominees may be submitted by incumbent directors and past directors.

The Board of Directors shall, after giving due consideration to such recommendations and such other persons as it may wish to consider, elect new Directors at the annual meeting.

- 2.4 <u>Removal</u>. Directors may be removed, with or without cause, by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all other Directors at a special meeting of the Directors called for that purpose.
- 2.5 <u>Vacancies</u>. Any Director may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chairman, President, or the Secretary of the Corporation. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein, and, if not specified therein, it shall take effect upon receipt and the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors for any reason may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Directors then in office. A Director elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor and until his or her successor is elected and qualified or until his or her earlier death, resignation, or removal.

- 2.6 Regular Meetings. A regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held on the fourth Wednesday of July of each year or at such other time as may be designated by the Board of Directors for the purpose of electing Officers and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the meeting. There shall be no less than one (1) annual meeting of the Board of Directors in each calendar year, and the Board of Directors shall provide by resolution the time and place for the holding of such additional regular meetings.
- 2.7 <u>Special Meetings</u>. The Chairman may call a special meeting of the. Board of Directors whenever he or she deems it necessary, and shall call a special meeting whenever requested to do so in writing by two (2) or more Directors or by the President. The Chairman shall fix the place and time for holding any special meeting of the Board of Directors. Notice of each special meeting stating the purpose, place, day, and hour of the meeting shall be given to each Director at his or her last known

business or home address at least five (5) days prior thereto by the mailing of written notice, or at least two (2) days prior thereto by personal delivery of written notice or by telephonic or telegraphic notice or other electronic means of notice (and the method of notice need not be the same for each Director). If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be given when deposited in the United States mail, with postage thereon prepaid. If sent by facsimile machine or other electronic means, such notice shall be deemed to be given when the facsimile machine or other electronic means prints or acknowledges that the transmission was successfully executed. Notice may only be given by electronic mail (email) with the consent of the Director to whom the notice is given.

- 2.8 <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. Any Director may waive receipt of notice of any meeting before, at, or after such meeting. The attendance of a Director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting except where a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of convening the meeting or objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted nor the purpose of any regular meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.
- 2.9 <u>Presumption of Assent.</u> A Director of the Corporation who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors at which action on a corporate matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his or her dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting, or unless he or she shall file his or her written dissent to such action with the person acting as the Secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof or shall forward such dissent by registered mail to the Secretary of the Corporation immediately after adjournment of the meeting or if dissent is not noted when the minutes are circulated or approved, the dissenting Director(s) may direct its inclusion. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a Director who voted in favor of such action.
- 2.10 Quorum and Voting. A majority of the Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Directors. The sole incorporator, so long as he serves as a member in good standing of the Board of Directors of the Corporation, shall have weighted voting rights on all corporate matters, specifically, he shall have a vote equal to the number of members of the Board of Directors. Except as set forth in the preceding sentence, each Director shall be entitled to one (1) vote and the vote of a majority of the Directors present in person at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors unless a greater number is specifically required by these Bylaws, by the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation or by state law. If less than a quorum is present at a meeting, a majority of the Directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice other than announcement at the meeting, until a quorum shall be present. A Director may not vote or act by proxy at any meeting of Directors.
- 2.11 <u>Compensation</u>. By resolution of the Board of Directors, a fixed sum for expenses of attendance may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special

meeting of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall have the power, in its discretion, to pay to Directors a fixed sum for attendance at each meeting of the Board of Directors, or alternatively, a reasonable salary as allowed under Section 4941 of the Code. No such payment shall preclude any Director from serving the Corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore.

- 2.12 <u>Meetings by Telephone or Teleconference</u>. Members of the Board of Directors or any Committee may participate in a meeting of the Board or Committee by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time. Such participation shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.
- 2.13 Action Without a Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Directors or any Committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken or to be taken, is signed by all of the Directors or Committee members entitled to vote upon such action at a meeting. Such consent (which may be signed in counterparts) shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote of the Directors or Committee members.
- 2.14 <u>Chairman and Vice-Chairman</u>. At its annual organizational meeting, the Board of Directors shall elect, from among those who are, or are to be, Directors of the Corporation, a Chairman and Vice-Chairman. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Directors, or in the absence of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman shall preside.

# ARTICLE III OFFICERS AND AGENTS

- 3.1 <u>Number and Qualifications</u>. The Officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other Officers and Agents, including one or more Vice-Presidents, as may be deemed necessary or desirable by the Corporation's Directors. However, pursuant to Section 3.4 hereof, Vice-Presidents and Officers other than those mentioned herein, if any, may be appointed by the President with the concurrence of the Board. One person may hold more than one office at a time, except that no person may simultaneously hold the offices of President and Secretary.
- 12 <u>Election and Term of Office</u>. The Officers of the Corporation shall be elected, for a term commencing on election, by the Corporation's Directors at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors. Each Officer shall hold office for a term of one (1) year or until his or her successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified, or until his or her earlier death, resignation, or removal.
- 3.3 <u>Compensation</u>. Officers shall serve with such compensation as is agreed upon by the Board of Directors and as is not inconsistent with compensation as allowed under Section 4941 of the Code. No Officer shall be prevented from receiving

such compensation by reason of the fact that he or she is also a Director of the Corporation.

- 3.4 Other Officers. Pursuant to Section 3.1 hereof, the President with the concurrence of the Board of Directors may appoint from time to time such other Officers as he or she shall deem necessary. These Officers shall have such authority, perform such duties, and receive such reasonable compensation, if any, as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine, so far as may be consistent with these Bylaws and to the extent authorized or permitted by law.
- 3.5 Removal. Any Officer or Agent may be removed without cause by a vote of three-quarters (3/4) of the Board of Directors then in office or with cause by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Board of Directors then in office at a special meeting called for that purpose.
- 3.6 <u>Vacancies</u>. Any Officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Chairman, the President, or the Secretary. An Officer's resignation shall take effect at the time specified in such notice, and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- 3.7 <u>Authority and Duties of Officers</u> The Officers of the Corporation shall have the authority and shall exercise the powers and perform the duties specified by the President, the Board of Directors, or these Bylaws, except that in any event each Officer shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be required by law.
- 3.8 <u>President.</u> The Board of Directors shall elect a President who shall carry on the general affairs of the Corporation. The President may, but is not required to, be a Director. The President shall make an annual report and periodic reports to the Board of Directors concerning the activities of the Corporation. He or she shall comply with all orders from the Board of Directors. The President shall have the authority to sign in the name of the Corporation all contracts authorized generally or specifically by the Board of Directors, unless the Board shall specifically require additional signatures. He or she shall perform such other duties as may be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- 3.9 <u>Vice-Presidents</u>. The Vice-Presidents shall have such powers and duties as may be assigned to them by the President. In the absence of a President, the Vice-Presidents, in the order designated by the President and concurred in by the Board of Directors, shall in general perform the duties of the President.
- 3.10 Secretary. The Board of Directors shall elect a Secretary who shall attend the meetings of the Directors and, to the extent feasible, of all Committees of the Board, and shall record or cause to be recorded by the Assistant Secretary the proceedings of the Corporation and of the Board of Directors and of all Committees of the Board, at their respective meetings. He or she shall provide or cause to be provided by the Assistant Secretary notification of the Directors of the Corporation of their meetings in accordance with these Bylaws, and shall perform such other duties as

may be required by these Bylaws or as may be assigned by the Board of Directors or the President.

- 3.11 <u>Assistant Secretary</u> The Board of Directors shall elect an Assistant Secretary who may or may not be a member of the Board of Directors, who shall attend all meetings of the Directors and its Committees, shall be the custodian of the corporate records and seal, shall furnish certifications of Board actions, Bylaws, and organizational documents, and shall perform such other duties as may be required by these Bylaws or as may be assigned by the Board of Directors or the President.
- 3.12 <u>Treasurer</u>. The Board of Directors shall elect a Treasurer who shall be the financial officer of the Corporation and shall receive and deposit in a bank or banks to be approved by the Board of Directors all the monies of the Corporation and keep an accurate account thereof. He or she shall oversee disbursements subject to such regulations as may be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors, and shall make reports of the finances of the Corporation annually and whenever requested by the Board of Directors. He or she shall perform such other duties as may be required by these Bylaws or as may be assigned by the Board of Directors or the President. At the end of his or her term of office, the Treasurer shall deliver to his or her successor all books, monies, and other property of the Corporation then in his or her possession.

### ARTICLE IV COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

4.1 <u>Designation of Committees</u>. The Board of Directors may designate one or more standing or special Committees to direct the business of the Corporation. Each such Committee may exercise the authority granted to it by the Board's enabling resolution.

# ARTICLE V RIGHT TO INDEMNIFICATION AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

5.1 Right to Indemnification. The Corporation shall indemnify any person, his or her respective heirs, administrators, successors, and assigns, made a party, or threatened to be made a party, to any action, suit or proceeding, whether civil or criminal, administrative or investigative, by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a Director, Officer, or employee of the Corporation, or of any corporation or enterprise which he or she served in such capacity at the request of the Corporation, against reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees, actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with the defense of the action, suit, or proceeding or in connection with any appeal thereof. This right to indemnification applies if he or she acted in good faith in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interest of the Corporation and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful. The right to indemnification conferred

by this section shall not restrict the power of the Corporation to make any indemnification permitted by law.

- 5.2 <u>Limitation of Liability</u>. No person shall be liable to the Corporation for any loss or damage suffered by it on account of any action taken or omitted to be taken by him or her as a Director, Officer or employee of the Corporation in good faith, if this person:
- (a) Reliance Upon Financial Information. Relied upon financial statements of the Corporation represented to him or her to be correct by the Officer of the Corporation having charge of its books of account or stated in a written report by an independent public or certified public accountant or firm of such accountants fairly to reflect the financial condition of the Corporation; or considered the assets to be of their book value;
- (b) <u>Reliance Upon Counsel</u>. Relied upon the advice of legal counsel or other persons as to the matters which are within the person's professional or expert competence;
- (c) <u>Reliance Upon Officers or Employees</u>. Relied upon the advice/opinion of one or more Officers or employees of the Corporation who is believed to be reliable and competent in the matters presented; or
- (d) <u>Reliance Upon Committee</u>. Relied upon a Committee of the Board of Directors of the Corporation of which he is not a member.

#### ARTICLE VI MISCELLANEOUS

- 6.1 <u>Books and Minutes</u>. The Corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and financial statements and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors and Committees. All books and records of the Corporation may be inspected by any Director or his or her accredited agent or attorney, for any proper purpose at any reasonable time, and by such members who may have voting rights.
- 6.2 <u>Fiscal Year and Audit</u>. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be January 1 through December 31, inclusive. After the close of each fiscal year of the Corporation, financial transactions of the Corporation for the preceding fiscal year shall be reviewed by certified public accountants, as directed by the Board of Directors, and a report of the review shall be made to the Board of Directors within ninety (90) days after the close of the fiscal year.
- 6.3 <u>Conveyances and Encumbrances</u>. Property of the Corporation may be assigned, conveyed or encumbered by such Officers of the Corporation as may be authorized to do so by the Board of Directors, and such authorized persons shall have

power to execute and deliver any and all instruments of assignment, conveyance and encumbrance.

- 6.4 Loans to Directors and Officers Prohibited. No loans or advances, other than customary travel advances, shall be made by the Corporation to any of its Directors or Officers.
- 6.5 No Private Inurement. The Corporation is not organized for profit and is to be operated exclusively for one or more of the purposes specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, and to engage in charitable, educational and other non-profit activities in accordance with the purposes stated in the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation. The net earnings of the Corporation shall be devoted exclusively to charitable and educational purposes and shall not inure to the benefit of any private individual. No Director or person from whom the Corporation may receive any property or funds shall receive or shall be entitled to receive any pecuniary profit from the operation thereof, and in no event shall any part of the funds or assets of the Corporation be paid as salary or compensation to, or distributed to, or inure to the benefit of, any member of the Board of Directors, except as provided in Section 2.11 above.
- 6.6 References to Internal Revenue Code. All references in these Bylaws to provisions of the Internal Revenue Code are to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and shall include the corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- These Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws may be Amendments. amended, repealed, or modified, and new Bylaws adopted, by the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the entire Board of Directors. Any notice of a meeting at which the Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws are to be amended, repealed, or modified shall include notice of such proposed action. In no event shall the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws be amended, repealed or modified in such a manner as to permit any Director, Officer, Agent or any employee of the Corporation ever to receive any compensation or any pecuniary benefit from the Corporation (except reasonable compensation for services actually rendered to the Corporation and reimbursement of expenditures incurred in effecting one or more of its purposes), to receive any part of the property or assets of the Corporation upon its dissolution or termination, or to permit any part of the activities of the Corporation to consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. In addition, no amendments, alteration or repeal shall be effected which would result in the denial of tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and the regulations thereunder or which would subject it to tax or other penalty under provisions relating to private foundations contained in the Code and the regulations thereunder.

- 6.8 <u>Dissolution</u>. On dissolution of the Corporation, all of its net assets shall be paid over or transferred to one or more exempt organizations of the kind described in Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3). The organization to receive such property shall be designated by the Board of Directors. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court in and for the City of Bristol, Virginia, exclusively for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3), or to such organization or organizations as such court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
- 6.9 <u>Severability</u>. The invalidity of any provision of these Bylaws shall not affect the other provisions hereof, and in such event, these Bylaws shall be construed in all respects as if such invalid provisions were omitted.
