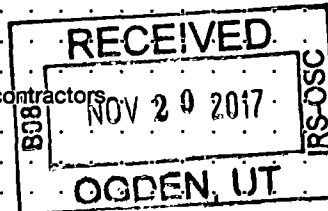

Part III - Primary exempt purpose: The mission of Alliance for Haiti's Children is to partner with rural communities in Haiti to provide a quality education for their children by building education capacity throughout local schools. Our replicable model improves education through six integrated programs: an academic enrichment program comprised of an interscholastic academic competition and a summer enrichment camp; student sponsorships, school improvements and academic resources; teacher training; all supported by a community library and computer lab. The support to the recently built community vocational school provides training to enhance student job placement opportunities. The program operates in La Vallée de Jacmel, Haiti

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Line 28: In 2016 the Academic Enrichment program provided an after-school interscholastic competition for area students and a summer enrichment camp.

Approximately 4000 students from 15 local schools benefited from these programs. The academic competition among 15 schools provided weekly quiz contests based on the Haitian national curriculum. Students competed for placement on school teams which then competed against each other.

The competition has had demonstrable results, raising passing rates on national exams by 5-30%.

The 2016 summer enrichment camp for 128 students from 11 schools, included instruction in basic computer literacy, English, arts and athletics.

The two-week camp employed local students as counselors and translators, and provided lunch and potable water. U.S. teachers demonstrated new pedagogical methods for local teachers and principals during the program. Interactive classroom materials, books, computers, software, art materials and athletic equipment were also provided for the camp. These materials were donated to local schools and the community library after the camp concluded.

Line 29: School and Community Support: In 2016, the Alliance provided support to the La Vallée community and 12 schools including the local vocational school. Funding granted to the Vocational School, Ecole Technique Frere Andre Guimond, allowed expansion of the training programs in hospitality and construction, which teach skills for job placement. In October, the effects of Hurricane Matthew were catastrophic to the La Vallée community. The Alliance's hurricane relief efforts included providing 53,000 school lunches; seeds and materials to initiate a school garden program at 6 schools; and replacement of damaged school supplies and academic materials for 10 schools.

Line 30: Professional Teacher Training: In 2016, the expanded teacher training program provided 60 hours of innovative training for 50 La Vallée teachers, including all teachers and principals from 6 area primary schools, by the Centre D'Apprentissage et De Formation Pour La Transformation (CAFT). All participants received government-recognized certification upon completion. Funding for this professional teacher training program was provided by a generous grant from the WK Kellogg Foundation.

Line 31: Other Program Services provided in 2016 included:

* Tuition scholarships for 271 students attending 13 area schools. These sponsorships provided tuition, books and uniforms as needed.

* Continued support for the only community library and public computer lab in the region. It afforded the community of over 40,000 people including 10,000 school-aged children access to computer training and the world of online learning for the first time. In addition, the Alliance purchased hundreds of books in Kreyol and French, including textbooks, research materials and books for pleasure reading. In 2016, more than 500 students and community members visited the library each month. Two librarians assisted students with computer training, research, typing and copying. In 2016, in response to the destruction caused by Hurricane Matthew, the Alliance funded the replacement and repairs needed to the library and computer lab facility.

* In 2016, the Alliance continued it's sister city partnership with the Fonds des Blancs community to explore future collaboration in health care and education.
