ACTIVITY ONE

Brookfield Arts Foundation (the "Foundation") was founded in 2000 to establish, maintain and operate an educational organization for the purpose of improving popular and scholarly understanding of art or craft. The Foundation seeks to promote research into techniques of manufacture, construction and the like and into the scientific analysis of materials and of original techniques, to provide care and conserve objects owned by the Foundation; with the intent of making the results of research on such objects available both to other scholars and to the general public; to publically exhibit such objects owned by the Foundation (the "Collection") often in collaboration with public exhibits of similar objects owned by others; and to make grants and loans of such objects to other organizations which are exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code.") The Foundation is organized as a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Delaware.

During 2016 the Foundation had on loan 605 objects from the Collection to seven different, major museums for display to the public. As listed on the schedule of assets the Foundation has on loan an historic house and its furnishings, which number 546.

In 2016, five objects from the Collection were included in new publications.

During 2016, the Foundation hosted four visits from scholars or researchers in particular specialties to examine in detail objects from the Collection.

In 2016, twenty five objects from the collection underwent conservation treatment. This treatment included stabilizing fragile objects as well as extensive treatments on objects with more complex condition issues, with the goal of future public display in mind.
