College scholarships: High school seniors of our consumer/members fill out a provided application to apply for the scholarship. Applicants are then reviewed by a team that includes management of Midwest Electric and Wright State University staff members. Of the applications received (this past year around sixty), only seven applicants will receive a scholarship. Checks are made out directly to the award recipient.

Energy-efficient home rebate: Only future home owners of new construction that will be served by Midwest Electric may apply for this rebate. They contact Midwest Electric with their intent and Midwest Electric staff reviews the rebate parameters with the future homeowner. To receive the rebate, the newly built home must pass all Ohio building code requirements including those for energy efficiency. The new home must also have an electric water heater and an air-source heat pump or geothermal system.

Energy audit rebate: Midwest Electric members who wish to have a home or commercial energy audit performed will contact the office. Midwest will have an independent energy auditor meet the homeowner (or business owner) and conduct an audit of their home (or business) and provide the homeowner with a report that identifies ways (and expected payback) to address energy losses to help lower their energy bill. Midwest Electric will pay one-half of the audit fee. If the homeowner makes some of the improvements suggested, Midwest Electric will pay the entire audit fee.

Lighting rebate: In addition to offering a rebate to commercial members who upgrade their inefficient lighting, Midwest Electric will extend the same offer to residential members who operate a business enterprise as an individual (i.e. a small farm). For every watt of lighting load that is reduced, Midwest Electric will rebate the project cost \$1 up to the lesser of \$5,000 or 50% of the total project cost. Some residents had multiple projects in multiple locations.

In-Home Appliance and Weatherization rebate program: Cooperative members were invited throughout the calendar year to have certain major appliances upgraded that consume large amounts of electricity. Eligible appliances included water heaters, geothermal systems, and dual fuel heating systems. To receive the rebate, (1) the appliance had to be installed in the calendar year, (2) each water heater had to allow a load-control device to be wired into the appliance's electrical supply, and (3) each geothermal and dual fuel heating system must be accompanied with an electric water heater (with a load control device). The cooperative's power supplier, Buckeye Power, would then cycle through the load control devices whenever their power peak was coincidental with the regional transmission operator's critical peaks. The program is designed to help the homeowner lower their energy consumption with modern appliances and help the cooperative lower its' contribution to critical peak pricing. By reducing some/all of the coincidental peaks, we were able to pass that avoided cost savings back to the ultimate consumer/member with a reduction in the power cost adjustment revenue rider. Each qualified water heater received a \$100 rebate and the approved heating systems received a \$200 rebate. Since 2013, members with electric heat sources were encouraged to add insulation and conduct air sealing projects. Each qualified insulation/air sealing project was eligible for a \$200 rebate. Some consumers were able to qualify for multiple rebates.

Additionally, if any reportable situation was known or observed by another governing member, they were expressed with the necessity to come forward with that information.

990 Core, Page 7, Part VII, Section A, Item 1a (10): On February 22, 2017, Rick Gerdeman, the acting CEO for the entire 2016 calendar year retired. After the board identified potential replacements, assessed internal staff capabilities, and interviewed multiple candidates, the board promoted the Interim CEO, Matthew Berry, to the role of CEO on May 29, 2017. Therefore, with the timing of change in roles, Mr. Berry has signed this return and not Mr. Gerdeman.

990 Core, Page 10, Part IX, Line 4: In adhering to IRS 990 instructions, patronage capital retired to active and former members for the calendar year is reported on this line. Conceptually, patronage capital represents a member's ownership in a cooperative and any retirement of patronage capital is, in fact, a return of that investment and not a traditional expense as viewed in standard accounting rules. By including this amount on the statement of functional expenses, we have overstated our current year's expense by \$1,379,926 and we had to create a balancing adjustment on Line 24d to properly adjust our expenses back to GAAP and USDA accounting methodology.

990 Core, Page 10, Part IX, Line 24d: In adhering to the IRS 990 instructions for expense disclosures on Part IX, Statement of Functional Expenses, items that are not treated as current year expenses on our audited statements have been overstated on this tax return. For instance, large portions of labor, labor overhead, and subcontracted labor are capitalized in the cooperative's fixed assets in accordance with USDA accounting procedures. These assets have a multi-year life and are either depreciated or amortized over their useful life. Therefore, by reporting our gross payrolls in lines 5, 7, 8, 9, and 10, we need to recognize an offsetting amount in line 24d to properly identify these labor costs that have been capitalized as an element of fixed assets. In addition, as stated above in Line 4, the retirement of patronage capital is not viewed as a traditional expense but rather as a return of invested capital. Therefore, the entire amount on line 4 (\$1,379,926) is not considered an expense for GAAP or USDA standards and by including this amount on Line 4, we need to create an offset amount on line 24d to successfully adjust our Total Functional Expenses back to the audited balance of \$27,579,813.
