Inc. has been providing comprehensive, advanced medical care primarily to Elkhart County and other contiguous counties in north central Indiana and south central Michigan for over 100 years Elkhart General Hospital, Inc. consists of a 365-bed licensed hospital that provides services without regard to patient race, religion, national origin, economic status, or ability to pay During 2016, the Hospital admitted 10,887 patients for a total of 44,363 inpatient days. 
