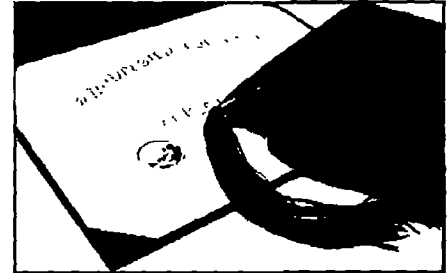

Continuing a proud tradition...

Ryerson supports the educational aspirations of employees' children through the Ryerson Foundation. The company has long believed that investing in the future of youth is good business and continues that proud tradition by awarding annual college scholarships.



Purpose

The Ryerson Scholarship Program provides scholarships to legally defined dependant children of Ryerson employees who have demonstrated, through their academic achievements and leadership abilities in high school, that they have potential to succeed in college and in their future endeavors. The scholarships are intended to assist those selected to attend the college or university of their choice and to realize their academic and career objectives.

Eligibility

Any legally defined dependant child of a U.S. or Canada-based Ryerson employee is eligible to apply for the Ryerson Scholarship. The child may be a stepchild, legal ward, or legally adopted child. The employee must be fulltime, or may be retired, disabled, or deceased. The active employee must have completed one year of continuous service with Ryerson as of March 1 of the year the scholarship is awarded. Applying students must be seniors/12th graders graduating from high school in the year the scholarship is awarded, while in Quebec, only students graduating from CEGEP in the year the scholarship is awarded are eligible.

Stipends

Except for one-time honorary awards, the Ryerson Scholarship Program is need based and recipients will, to the extent possible, reflect the diversity of the Ryerson workforce. This means that the amount of the stipend will depend on the financial need of the qualifying student. Financial need is defined as the difference between the financial resources available to meet the qualifying student's college costs (parent contribution, student contribution from savings, employment and assets; plus financial aid from other scholarships and sources) and the annual cost of the college selected. The stipend amount ranges from a one time \$1,000 (US) honorary award to a maximum of \$2,000 (US) for each of the four successive years the qualifying student is in college. A key factor in determining the amount of the four year scholarship, applicable to U.S. based students only, is the analysis of the Student Aid Report (SAR) obtained by filing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Application

Information about the Ryerson Scholarship Program is circulated in the fall of each year via company mailings and emails. Flyers announcing the beginning of the application process are distributed to all business units to display in designated places at all Company locations and on RYNET. Interested employees should notify the Ryerson Scholarship Office by completing and submitting the form provided. Upon receipt of that completed form, a packet containing a formal application and supporting documents, along with instructions, will be sent to the applicant. The applicant is responsible for having all forms completed and supporting documentation assembled and returned to the scholarship office by the stated deadlines.



Selection

Completed applications and supporting documents will be reviewed by the selection committee, which is independent of Ryerson and comprised of education professionals. Winners will be selected on the basis of their high school records, the results of their SAT or ACT scores (U.S. only), their leadership activities in school and in the community, and their future academic and career potential. The composition of winners will, to the extent possible, reflect the diversity of the Ryerson workforce. (Note: The selection committee prefers applicants take the SAT, but it accepts the ACT from students not otherwise required to take the SAT.) Students who have experienced difficult circumstances at home or in school, or who have attended schools with limited opportunities, but who have nonetheless compiled exemplary high school records and show promise of completing their college education, are given equal consideration. The number of new scholarships granted each year is determined by the budget approved by Ryerson.

Notification

All applicants, winners and non-winners, are notified of the selection committee's decision by May of each year. Winners are not advised of the amount of their scholarship stipend until other scholarship programs announce their awards and after the applicants have decided what college to attend.



Use of Awards

A Ryerson Scholarship may be used at any regionally accredited college, university or technical school as approved by the selection committee. Approved institutions maintain a regular faculty, curriculum and an organized body of students in attendance. Their programs of study should lead to a bachelor's degree over a minimum of four years. The student must maintain a full-time student status. A student may enroll in a program of shorter duration if credits earned in that program are transferable into a four-year program.

Renewal

Except for the one-time honorary awards, Ryerson Scholarships awarded to U.S. based students are renewable on a year-to-year basis during four consecutive years of undergraduate study for a bachelor's degree. The student must make satisfactory

academic progress, maintaining good academic standing, which means a minimum C+ average must be met each consecutive term (minimum grade of 75%) in order for the scholarship to continue. The student must also continue to furnish the necessary documentation to demonstrate financial need for each successive school year. Additionally, the student must take and complete a full-time course of study. If the student is enrolled in a five-year undergraduate degree program, the selection committee may consider extending the scholarship for an additional year if the student's academic record warrants it.

Scholarship recipients transferring to another college or university are required to submit photo copies of the Student Aid Report for the current award year. All students must forward copies of their official transcripts to the Ryerson Scholarship Office at the end of each school year. Failure to do so could delay timely payment of stipends at the beginning of the following school year. Renewal of a Ryerson Scholarship is not contingent upon continued employment of the student's parent by Ryerson

Adjustment of Scholarship Stipend

An upward or downward adjustment of a student's annual stipend may occur, depending on the circumstances. Such circumstances include a change of college or university or a change in a student's financial situation. For example, if a student's financial need increases substantially during the four years of eligibility, the stipend committee will consider increasing the amount of the stipend. A written request must be forwarded to the Ryerson Scholarship Office explaining the circumstances involved. If the additional assistance substantially alters the amount of financial need, the stipend committee may reduce the amount of the Ryerson stipend. The student must submit the Student Aid Report (SAR) by March of each year following their selection as a scholarship recipient.

Change in Value of Awards

If the maximum and/or minimum stipends are increased by Ryerson, the new amounts will apply for those scholarships awarded that school year and in future years. Renewals will continue at the amounts in effect at the time those scholarships were awarded.

Payments

Stipends are paid directly to the college or university in August of each year. The stipends are credited to the student's account, with the amount divided equally between semesters or among quarters, as appropriate. To initiate payment, entering freshmen must send the Ryerson Scholarship Office a copy of their official notice of registration. **Upper classmen are responsible for sending the Ryerson Scholarship Office a copy of their official transcripts at the end of each school year and the SAR by March of each year.**

Interruptions

In case of illness, military service or other temporary interruption of studies for personal or financial reasons, Ryerson Scholarships will be temporarily withheld. At the appropriate time, a written request can be made to the Scholarship Office for reinstatement if the student left his or her previous institution in good academic standing.

Other Company-Sponsored Scholarships

All finalists are eligible to receive only one scholarship funded by Ryerson.
