Multiple strategies were adopted to address each identified priority.

HFAH serves as the "champions" for multiple strategies. While measuring improvement in health status for every priority can be challenging in the short term, updated data indicates local improvement in a number of areas including:

- o Proportion of Jackson County residents that received advice about their weight from a health care provider increased from 27% in 2010 CHNA to 39% in 2013 CHNA and 42% in 2015 CHNA.
- o Number of Jackson residents with low access to fresh food decreased from 19,000 to 12,000 from 2013 CHNA to 2015 CHNA.
- o Proportion of smokers who report receiving advice from their provider to quit increased from 61% to 68% from 2013 CHNA to 2015 CHNA.
- o Percent of adults who would 'definitely' seek professional help for a serious emotional problem increased from 54% to 63% from 2013 CHNA to 2015 CHNA.

In terms of significant health needs that will not be addressed, Henry

emerged from the CHNA process, and determined it could most effectively

focus on those health needs that were determined to be most urgent and

When a potential conflict of interest is identified, the Compliance Committee is responsible for review of the conflict of interest for compliance with the policy. Also, General Counsel routinely reviews upcoming Board and Committee meeting agendas to assess potential conflict situations.

Trustees, directors, and key employees are required to fill out an annual

conflict of interest questionnaire. Board Trustees identified as having a conflict of interest are permitted to discuss the potential transaction. They are not allowed to deliberate in the decision or vote on the matter.

The Compensation Committee, an independent committee of the Board of Trustees, is responsible for the executive compensation program. committee performs an annual review of the competitiveness, reasonablenes and effectiveness of all executive cash compensation and benefit programs. The committee also leads the Board in evaluating the performance of the Chief Executive Officer and recommends all aspects of the Chief Executive Officer's compensation. The committee reviews the Chief Executive Officer's recommendations regarding the compensation of all other members of executive leadership.

The Compensation Committee engages an independent compensation consulting firm to conduct a comprehensive market analysis of total compensation for executive leadership. This firm uses data representing compensation levels and practices from national not-for-profit healthcare markets as Henry Ford Allegiance Health typically competes to the the national healthcare marketplace for executive talent.
