SPONSOR HEALTH AND COMMUNITY INITIATIVES We provide financial sponsorships to a variety of organizations that promote health activities and initiatives that make our community better. I. STRENGTHEN ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE EYE CARE SERVICES Without good vision, many adults and children are not able to be successful at their jobs or in school. At GHC-SCW, our primary care providers along with school nurses refer patients that are uninsured to our Eye Care Center for exams and glasses. In 2016, we provided \$1,590 in eye care services to uninsured individuals living in our community. BADGERCARE PLUS One of the most pressing issues in our community is the role that poverty plays on the health and well-being of individuals and families. In Dane County, 11.2% of the population lives below the poverty level per the most recent U.S. Census data. With the help of the state of Wisconsin's Medicaid program, BadgerCare Plus, eligible families can get the medical care they need. In 2016, we proudly served 9,129 BadgerCare Plus members. In addition, we provided \$8,831,138 in care to our BadgerCare Plus members in 2016. BRIDGES TO ACCESS Many families in the Madison area do not have a safe, warm place to call home. Our commitment to schoolchildren was demonstrated in many ways throughout the year. To help build up the future leaders of our community, we provided medical supplies to school nurse offices. We donated \$15,000 to help in developing Crock Pot Classes. GHC-SCW supports all our Adopt-A-School nursing offices by purchasing sweat pants, under clothes, Nixs and healthy snacks. Sensory items were purchased for special needs children, a String program was developed, and a grant was given for English and Spanish books to enhance a school's library. GHC-SCW staff donated items for 23 winter boxes full of clothing, healthy food and educational books for local families in 2016. For twelve years, we've worked together with the Foundation for Madison's Public Schools to bring this service to our community. ALPHA KAP PA ALPHA, WALK IT OUT Walk It Out, a community event held at Warner Park, promotes physical activity among African American women. The event was focused around a 2-mile walk and 3-mile run and we provided health education opportunities for healthy cooking and a variety of healthy activities like Zumba, Yoga, and Cardio. For eight years we've worked together with the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and the 100 Black Men organization to bring this service to our community. ENGLISH FOR HEALTH Literacy skills are a strong predictor of an individual's health status. In fact, low literacy may contribute to serious health problems - problems that tend to compound for those with English as their second language. To improve health literacy, we co-sponsored the "English for Health" course for adults in our community. Students learned from our health care professionals about a variety of health topics, from how to use emergency rooms and urgent care clinics to healthy lifestyle choices. Then they practiced communicating health care decisions in a mock clinic staffed by health care professionals. For the past six years GHC-SCW has worked with the Literacy Network to bring this service to our community. FARM FRESH PRODUCE We all know that locally grown food makes sense. But too often, low-income kids don't get the fresh fruits and vegetables they need on their plates. And getting kids to eat those vegetables can be tricky. So, we brought a regular supply of fresh, nutritious, and locally grown organic vegetables to kids at four community centers. We also taught them about where their food comes from through fun gardening activities. In total, more than 1 ton of fresh produce was distributed in 2016. For nine years we've worked together with Community GroundWorks, the Fair Share CSA Coalition, the Public Health Department of Madison and Dane County, and Second Harvest to bring this service to our community. HEALTHCARE ADMINISTRATIVE TRAINING We believe in helping people succeed through education.

That's why for 2016, InfoShare focused on how to escape the Wisconsin winter blues by learning ways to sustain and grow physical, mental, and emotional health and happiness. Participants were treated to a talk on how to bring mental, physical, and emotional health together, ways to relax and stretch to music, laughter, yoga, exploring art, massages provided by GHC-SCW and more! For years we have worked together with the UW-Madison Waisman Center Community Training and Consultation Program, the Dane County Human Services department, and other community organizations to bring this event to our community. Latino Health Council. For the past decade, we have helped promote the health and wellbeing of our Latino neighbors by serving on the Latino Health Council. Along with our participation on the council, we were deeply involved in efforts throughout the year to spread health knowledge to the community. We were present at health fairs to provide health checks and screenings for skin cancer and we sponsored an event to educate Latino teens about mental health and other health topics. Reach Out and Read. Fewer things are more important to a child's cognitive, emotional, and social health than the simple act of reading.
