Each application is reviewed individually.

The majority of funding and focus is placed on scholarships and grants.

All grant awards are on-going, with the exception of the CHS Foundation cooperative education grants program, which is a competitive grants program focused on investing in programs that develop and enhance the understanding of cooperative business through education, professional development and practical experience. Applications are accepted at chsinc.com/stewardship, annually, from late August to early November with announcements in January of the following year.

CHS Foundation High-School and Two-Year College Scholarship awards are focused on individuals pursuing an agricultural-related major at any two- or four-year college throughout the nation. Applicant limitations require each be a legal U.S. citizen or permanent resident. Applications are accepted at chsinc.com/stewardship, annually, from January to March with announcements in May. There are 100 \$1,000 scholarships available - selection committees are independent from the CHS Foundation.

CHS Foundation University Scholarship awards are focused on students working towards an agricultural-related degree to pursue a career in agribusiness or production agriculture. Students must be entering their sophomore, junior or senior year. Preference is given to students with an interest in agricultural-based cooperatives. The scholarship program is administered by designated colleges/universities and the selection committees are independent from the CHS Foundation. To apply, applicants should contact the financial aid, foundation or college of agriculture offices of the participating university (listing available at chsinc.com/stewardship).

**AMENDED AND RESTATED
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
CHS FOUNDATION**

The following Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation have been duly adopted by the Board of Trustees and Members of CHS Foundation (formerly Cenex Foundation), pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 317A of Minnesota Statutes, the Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this corporation shall be CHS Foundation.

ARTICLE II

Purpose

The purpose of this corporation is exclusively charitable, scientific, literary or educational within the meaning of Sections 170(c)(2) and 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), or such other provisions of Minnesota or federal law as may from time to time be applicable. Included among the charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes for which this corporation is organized are the following: developing future agricultural leaders, building strong rural communities, and improving agricultural safety. This corporation shall not be operated for profit but shall be operated exclusively for charitable purposes.

As provided in Minnesota Statutes § 317A.113, the following specific provisions shall govern the corporation as to the use, retention, and disposition of its income and property:

(a) **Minimum Required Distributions.** The corporation shall distribute for each of its taxable years amounts at least sufficient to avoid liability for the tax imposed by section 4942(a) of the Code;

(b) **No Self-Dealing.** The corporation may not engage in an act of "self-dealing" as defined in section 4941(d) of the Code that would give rise to liability for the tax imposed by section 4941(a) of the Code;

(c) **No Excess Business Holdings.** The corporation may not retain "excess business holdings" as defined in section 4943(c) of the Code that would give rise to liability for the tax imposed by section 4943(a) of the Code;

(d) **No Jeopardizing Investments.** The corporation may not make

investments that would jeopardize the carrying out of the exempt purposes of the corporation, within the meaning of section 4944 of the Code, so as to give rise to liability for the tax imposed by section 4944(a) of the Code; and

(e) No Taxable Expenditures. The corporation may not make a "taxable expenditure" as defined in section 4945(d) of the Code that would give rise to liability for the tax imposed by section 4945(a) of the Code.

ARTICLE III

Powers

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, all of the work of this corporation shall be carried on, and all funds of this corporation, whether income or principal and whether acquired by gift or contribution or otherwise, shall be used and applied exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, and in such manner that no part of the net earnings of this corporation will in any event inure to the benefit of any Member that is not an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or any officer or Trustee of this corporation or of any other corporation. This corporation shall not engage in activities that in themselves are not in furtherance of one or more of the exempt purposes specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and regulations issued thereunder. No part of the principal, assets or net income of this corporation shall in any event be paid or contributed to any other corporation, organization, foundation, fund, institution or governmental body, any substantial part of the activities of which consists of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation or which participates or intervenes in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office, nor shall this corporation itself engage in such activities in any way, directly or indirectly, except to the extent, if any, permitted by the Code, and regulations issued thereunder. No Member that is not an organization described in Section 501 (c)(3) of the Code, or any officer or Trustee of this corporation or other private individual shall be entitled to share in the distribution of the corporate assets on liquidation, dissolution, or winding up of this corporation. However, nothing contained in these Articles shall be construed to prevent distribution of the properties of this corporation to another distributee, otherwise properly made in accordance with the provisions of these Articles and the purposes herein stated, solely by reason of the fact that Member or one or more of the Trustees, or officers of this corporation may be connected or associated with the distributee as shareholder, member, director, officer or in any other capacity.

ARTICLE IV

Nondiscrimination

This corporation shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, sexual preference, status with regard to public assistance, disability or age.

ARTICLE V
Inurement of Income

This corporation does not and shall not afford pecuniary gain incidentally or otherwise to any Member (other than a Member that is a non-profit organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Code) or any private individual.

ARTICLE VI
Duration

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE VII
Registered Office

The registered office of this corporation shall be located at 5500 Cenex Drive, Inver Grove Heights, Minnesota 55077.

ARTICLE VIII
No Capital Stock; Member

This corporation shall have no capital stock but shall have one Member, CHS Inc. The Member shall have no personal liability for corporate obligations. No certificates of membership will be issued. The membership criteria, procedures for admission and membership terms shall be fixed in accordance with the Bylaws of the corporation. Members may be admitted for no consideration.

ARTICLE IX
Board of Trustees

Section 9.1. The management of this corporation shall be vested in the Board of Trustees. The number, qualification, term of office, method of election, powers, authorities and duties of the Trustees of this corporation, the time and place of their meetings, and such other provisions with respect to them as are not inconsistent with the express provisions of these Articles of Incorporation shall be as specified in the Bylaws of this corporation.

Section 9.2. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Trustees may be taken by written action signed by the number of Trustees required to take the same action at a meeting of the Board of Trustees at which all Trustees were present. The written action is effective when signed by the required number of Trustees, unless a different effective date is provided in the written action.

When written action is taken by less than all of the Trustees, all Trustees shall be notified immediately of its text and effective date, except that failure to provide such notice does not invalidate the written action. The signatures of the Trustees may be in electronic form in accordance with Minnesota Statutes § 317A.015 and in accordance with the Bylaws of the corporation.

ARTICLE X

Dissolution

In the event of the liquidation, dissolution or winding up of this corporation, whether voluntary or involuntary, or by operation of law, except as and to the extent otherwise provided or required by law, the remaining property and assets of this corporation shall be distributed as provided in the Bylaws of this corporation, or in the absence of any such provision in the Bylaws, in such manner as the Board of Trustees of this corporation, as constituted at the date of entry of the order allowing or directing the liquidation of this corporation's affairs, in their discretion shall by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Trustees determine to be best calculated to carry out the objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed; provided, however, that none of the property or assets of this corporation shall be distributed for purposes other than exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

ARTICLE XI

Amendment

These Articles may be amended at any time and from time to time by the affirmative vote of a majority of Trustees then in office, at a meeting for which notice of the meeting and the proposed amendment have been given.

**AMENDED AND RESTATED
BYLAWS
OF
CHS FOUNDATTON**

This instrument constitutes the Bylaws of CHS Foundation, adopted for the purpose of regulating and managing the internal affairs of this corporation.

**ARTICLE I
Corporate Seal**

Section 1. This corporation shall not have a seal.

**ARTICLE II
Member**

Section 2.1. This corporation shall have one voting Member, CHS Inc. A Member of this corporation may not transfer a membership or a right arising from it. A Member of this corporation is not, as such, personally liable for the acts, debts, liabilities, or obligations of the corporation.

Section 2.2. The Member shall meet at least annually and such meeting may take place at the regular annual meeting of the Trustees or such other time as the Trustees deem appropriate. At an annual meeting: (1) there shall be a report on the activities and financial condition of the corporation; and (2) the Member shall consider and act upon other matters as may be raised consistent with the notice of meeting requirements.

Section 2.3. The Member shall only have the following voting rights, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes: (1) approval of a plan of merger or consolidation in accordance with Minnesota Statutes § 317A.613; (2) approval of a sale, lease, transfer, or disposition of all or substantially all of the corporation's property and assets, including its good will, not in the usual and regular course of its activities in accordance with Minnesota Statutes § 317A.661; and (3) approval of a voluntary plan for dissolution in accordance with Minnesota Statutes § 317A.721.

**ARTICLE III
Board of Trustees**

Section 3.1. The business and charitable affairs of this Corporation shall be managed by or under the direction of a Board of Trustees (the "Board"). Each member of the Board may be referred to as a "Trustee" hereunder, and collectively, as the "Trustees." The Board shall consist of those individuals who from time to time shall constitute the Board of Directors of this corporation's Member, CHS Inc.

Section 3.2. Each Trustee shall serve for a term that is coterminous with his or her term of office as a director of CHS Inc.

Section 3.3. At all meetings of the Board a majority of the Trustees then in office shall be necessary and sufficient to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 3.4. Meetings by Remote Communication, Participation by Remote Communication.

- (a) A meeting of the Board may be held by conference call, or by one or more other means of Remote Communication through which all Trustees may participate in the meeting, if notice of the meeting is given as described in Section 3.13. Participation in a meeting by conference call or such other means of communication constitutes presence in person at the meeting.
- (b) With the consent of a majority of the Trustees who are present in person at the designated meeting place, a Trustee not physically present at that place may, by means of Remote Communication, participate in a meeting of the Board. Permitted participation by a Trustee by Remote Communication constitutes presence at the meeting in person.
- (c) For purposes of these Bylaws, "Remote Communication" means communication via Electronic Communication, conference telephone, video conference, the internet, or other means by which persons who are not physically present in the same location may communicate with each other on a substantially simultaneous basis. "Electronic Communication" means any form of communication, not directly involving the physical transmission of paper, which creates a record that may be retained, retrieved, and reviewed by a recipient of the communication, and reproduced in paper form by the recipient through an automated process. "Authenticated" means that the communication sets forth information from which the recipient can reasonably conclude that the communication was sent by the purported sender.

Section 3.5. Except where otherwise required by law, the Articles or these Bylaws, the affirmative vote of a majority of the Trustees present at a duly held meeting shall be sufficient for any action.

Section 3.6. Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board may be taken by written action signed or consented to by Authenticated Electronic Communication by the number of Trustees required to take the same action at a meeting of the Board at which all were present. The written action is effective when signed by the required number of Trustees, unless a different effective date is provided in the written action. When written action is taken by less than all of the Trustees, all Trustees shall be notified immediately of its text and effective date, except that failure to provide such notice does not invalidate the written action.

Section 3.7. The Board shall have meetings at such places and times as it shall establish. The annual meeting of the Board shall be held at such time and place as may be designated by resolution of the Board.

Section 3.8. The removal or resignation of a Trustee from the Board of Directors of CHS Inc. shall, without further action, result in his or her removal or resignation from the Board of this corporation.

Section 3.9. Special meetings of the Board may be called at any time upon request of the Chair, the President or any two (2) Trustees, provided that any such request shall specify the purpose or purposes of the meeting. The President shall set the date for the special meeting within three (3) working days of making or receiving such a request and shall give not less than five (5) nor more than thirty (30) days written notice of the time, place and purpose of such special meeting.

Section 3.10. The Board may establish one or more committees having the authority of the Board in the management of the business of the corporation to the extent determined by the Board. Committees are subject at all times to the direction and control of the Board. Committee members must be natural persons and must be Trustees of this corporation. Minutes, if any, of committee meetings must be made available upon request to members of the committee and to any Trustee. Committee members are subject to the provisions of Article V of these Bylaws, regarding standard of conduct and conflicts of interest, in the same manner as Trustees and Officers.

Section 3.11. Any Trustee may execute a written waiver of notice of any meeting required to be given by statute or by any provision of these Bylaws either before, at or after that meeting, and such waiver when signed and filed as hereinafter provided shall be equivalent to notice. Such waiver shall be filed with the Secretary, who shall enter it upon the minutes or other records of that meeting. Appearance at a meeting by a Trustee shall be deemed a waiver of notice thereof, unless the appearance is solely for the purpose of asserting the illegality of the meeting.

Section 3.12. The Board may hold its meetings at such places, whether in this state or in any other state, as a majority of the Trustees then in office may from time to time appoint. Upon failure to appoint any other place, such meetings shall be held at the registered office of this corporation.

Section 3.13. Whenever under the provisions of these Bylaws notice is required to be given to any Trustee, it shall be construed to require personal notice, but such notice may be given in writing by mail or by Authenticated Electronic Communication; or by facsimile addressed to such Trustee at his or her last known address, and such notice shall be deemed to have been given at a time when mailed or sent.

Section 3.14. Trustees shall not be compensated for their duties as Trustees, except that a Trustee may receive a salary for his or her services as an employee, and Trustees may be reimbursed for expenses incurred on behalf of this corporation.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

Section 4.1. The officers of this corporation shall be a Chair, one or more Vice-Chairs, a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other officers as the Board may, from time to time, appoint.

Section 4.2. The duties of the officers of this corporation shall be:

- (a) Chair – The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board and shall oversee the long term goals and purposes of this corporation. He or she shall also perform such other duties as may be determined from time to time by the Board.
- (b) Vice-Chair – the Vice-Chairs shall perform such duties as may be determined from time to time by the Board. The First Vice-Chair so designated shall be vested with all powers of and perform all the duties of the Chair in the Chair's absence or inability to act, but only so long as such absence or inability continues.
- (c) President – The President shall be the chief executive officer of this corporation and shall be responsible for the day to day operations of this corporation. In addition, he or she shall perform such other duties as may be determined from time to time by the Board.
- (d) Secretary – The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Board and any committee thereof or shall assign another officer or employee of the corporation to attend such meetings on his or her behalf. The Secretary shall oversee the maintenance of minutes of such meetings, the transmission of notices and the preparation any necessary certified copies of corporate records, and shall perform such other duties as may be determined from time to time by the Board.
- (e) Assistant Secretary – The Assistant Secretary shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the Board, the Chair, the President or the Secretary. In the absence or disability of the Secretary, or in the event of a vacancy in that office, the Assistant Secretary shall perform the duties of the Secretary.
- (f) Treasurer – The Treasurer shall have charge of the corporate treasury, receiving and keeping the monies of this corporation, and disbursing corporate funds as authorized. The Treasurer shall perform such other duties as may be determined from time to time by the Board.
- (g) Assistant Treasurer – The Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the Board, the Chair, the President or the Treasurer. In the absence or disability of the Treasurer, or in the event of a vacancy in

that office, the Assistant Treasurer shall perform the duties of the Treasurer.

Section 4.3. The salaries of all officers of this corporation shall be fixed by the Board. However, no such salary need be fixed if such service is voluntary.

Section 4.4. The Chair and Vice-Chairs shall be members of the Board. All other officers may but need not be Trustees.

Section 4.5. An officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to this corporation. The resignation is effective without acceptance when the notice is given to this corporation, unless a later effective date is named in the notice.

Section 4.6. Any officer may be removed, with or without cause, by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Trustees present at a duly held meeting of the Board for which notice stating such purpose has been given.

Section 4.7. A vacancy in an office because of death, resignation or removal may be filled by the Board.

ARTICLE V

Standard of Care and Conflicts of Interest

Section 5.1. It is the responsibility of each officer and Trustee of this corporation to discharge his or her duties as a Trustee in good faith, in a manner the person reasonably believes to be in the best interests of this corporation, and with the care an ordinary prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances.

Section 5.2. The Trustees, Officers and Committee Members shall comply with the provisions of the Minnesota Nonprofit Corporation Act regarding conflicts of interest; the requirements applicable to organizations exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code; and the provisions of any Conflicts of Interest Policy adopted by resolution of the Board from time to time.

ARTICLE VI

Finance

Section 6.1. Any dues, contributions, grants, bequests or gifts made to this corporation shall be accepted or collected only as authorized by the Board.

Section 6.2. All contracts, checks and orders for the payment, receipt or deposit of money, and access to securities of the corporation shall be as provided by the Board.

Section 6.3. The annual budget of estimated income, income expense and capital expense shall be approved by the Board.

Section 6.4. A summary report of the financial operation of this corporation shall be made by the Treasurer at least annually to the Board.

Section 6.5. Unless otherwise ordered by the Board, the President shall have the power, on behalf of this corporation, to vote either in person or by proxy at any meeting of stockholders of any corporation in which this corporation may hold stock, and at any such meeting the President shall possess and may exercise all of the rights and powers incident to the ownership of such stock which, as the owner thereof, this corporation might have possessed and exercised if present. The Board may confer like powers upon any other person and may revoke any such powers at its pleasure.

ARTICLE VII

Indemnification

Section 7.01. General. This corporation shall indemnify its officers, Trustees, committee members, employees, and agents in the manner set forth in Minnesota Statutes, Section 317A.521, provided this corporation has made such determination or determinations, if any, as it may reasonably require to establish that the standards set forth in Minnesota Statutes Section 317A. 521, subd. 2, have been met. In addition, this corporation may, in the sole discretion of its Board, indemnify such persons or any other person under such circumstances or different circumstances as the Board shall deem appropriate as long as the Board reasonably believes such indemnification to be in the best interest of this corporation.

Section 7.02. Advancement of Expenses. If a person is made or threatened to be made a party to a civil, criminal, administrative, arbitration, or investigative proceeding, including a proceeding by or in the right of this corporation, the person is entitled, upon written request to this corporation, to payment or reimbursement by this corporation of reasonable expenses, including attorneys' fees and disbursements, incurred by the person in advance of the final disposition of the proceeding upon receipt by this corporation of a written affirmation by the person of a good-faith belief that the criteria for indemnification described in Section 7.01 above have been satisfied and a written undertaking by the person to repay the amounts paid or reimbursed by this corporation if it is determined that the criteria for indemnification have not been satisfied; and after a determination that the facts then known to those making the determination would not preclude indemnification under this section. The written undertaking is an unlimited general obligation of the person making it but need not be secured and must be accepted without reference to a financial ability to make the repayment.

Section 7.03. Rights Not Exclusive. The indemnification provided by this article shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Trustee, officer, employee, or agent and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person. Nothing contained in this article shall affect any rights to indemnification to which this corporation's personnel, other than Trustees and officers, may be entitled by contract or otherwise under law.

Section 7.04. Insurance. This corporation may buy and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a Trustee, officer, employee, or agent of this corporation or who is or was serving at the request of this corporation as a Trustee, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or

other enterprise against any liability asserted against him or her and incurred by him or her in any such capacity.

ARTICLE VIII
Amendment of Bylaws

The Board may from time to time adopt, amend or repeal all or any of the Bylaws of this corporation by an affirmative vote of a majority of Trustees then in office, at a meeting for which notice of the meeting and the proposed amendments have been given.
