

A transaction-level financial detail B project bank statements and bank reconciliations C cash reserves report. The projects are also required to submit or make a vailable the following documents on an annual basis: a annual budget b asset listing c government-required external audit d any other financial reports filed with their governments For special money gifts over \$100, projects are required to acknowledge the expenditures to the donors. There are five regional accountants in the international programs department at unbound. Each has responsibility for a number of projects, and reviews the monthly transactions and reports on a regular basis for timeliness, accuracy, completeness, and compliance with unbound financial and program policy. Regular feedback is given to the projects. Staff representatives from the unbound headquarters office visit each project at le ast once per year to assess program and administrative performance, visit program beneficial aries in their homes, and provide support and training to project teams. Formal performance audits are performed periodically, typically once every three years. In addition, the unbound finance department has a team of auditors who regularly audit the projects internal controls, processes and procedures, and the accuracy of their record

They included 281,210 child ren and youth, 29,379 elders and 277 candidates studying for religious vocations. Sponsore d individuals and their families were served through Unbound projects in Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Hond uras, India, Kenya, Madagascar, Mexico, Nicaragua, Peru, the Philippines, Tanzania, Uganda and Venezuela. Following are examples of achievements in the sponsorship program as Unbou ind works with individuals and families to break the cycle of poverty. Unbounds sponsorship program helps individuals and their families in 20 countries on a path out of poverty by connecting them with individual sponsors and supportive local communities of staff members and other families. Sponsors, through a monthly financial contribution and letters, exper ience other cultures, friendship with someone in another part of the world and a practical way to make a lasting difference in the life of a child or elder. In 2016, 636 people participated in 28 trips in 12 countries. Families participating in the sponsorship program use financial assistance to help with needs like education, nutrition, housing improvements, clothing and health care - in addition to leadership and economic development opportunities such as financial literacy, youth retreats and skill development for parents. The board syste matically monitors compliance with these executive limitations. As a result, the board con fidently assures donors that their contributions achieve their promised objectives, and that the organization remains transparent and ethical. Monitoring activities and evaluation methods. Unbound conducts financial and program audits of projects on a regular basis to en sure financial resources provide intended benefits and services and sponsored members are empowered to direct their own development. In addition, almost all projects receive at least one visit by headquarters staff every year. Staff members also accompany sponsors on Un bound awareness trips visiting projects and families in the Unbound program. In 2016, head quarters staff spent more than 1,216 total days in the field monitoring and supporting pro grams. In addition, the organization performs quality checks on letters and photos from sponsored friends to their sponsors, and monitors member retirement rates and sponsor retent ion rates. Unbound collects educational attendance and performance data and documents the final education level achieved by sponsored members leaving the program. Unbound projects around the world conduct evaluations in their local contexts to determine outcomes for sponsored members and their families. Methods include surveys of sponsored members on income and skill development, focus groups on attitudes and behavioral changes, and interviews to document empowerment. Organization-wide program evaluations focus on four key domains education, economic status, community participation and empowerment. Empowerment refers to o nes ability to make decisions for oneself and act freely in a way that is intentional and goal-oriented.

At a global level, at the point of leaving the program, 75 percent of sponsored children achieved a level of schooling comparative to or above national peer averages, according to data gathered from 2011-2014. This means that Unbound students - who experience marginalization based on economic, social and geographic factors - were able to compete and excel alongside students from all socioeconomic brackets and areas within their countries. Of these former sponsored children, 51 percent achieved educational levels a year or more above their national peer averages. The number jumped to 59 percent achieved educational levels a year or more above their national peer averages. The number girls This, along with country-I evel analysis, indicated a specific impact on girls education and a closing or reversing of the prominent gender gap present in many communities. And in Unbound's Quezon program in the Philippines, 57 percent of sponsored youth pursued post-secondary education compared to 30 percent of their peers. Unbounds direct work through a personalized benefit model and parent groups means families are able to best allocate re sources for their children and direct how the program supports their development as families. As of September 2014, 77 percent of all Unbound sponsored members participated in the program through small groups. These groups provide the space for families to have a voice in the program and be part of a supportive community, addressing two significant components of poverty lack of choices and isolation. In 2016, a pilot evaluation measuring the emp owerment among sponsored mothers in Kampala, Uganda, and Antipolo, Philippine

In addition, 90 percent of mothers of spo nsored children believe they have the power to change their familys situation, while 70 percent speak up about their ideas and opinions and 63 percent are active in solving problems in their communities, according to data acquired in 2013. Unbound is in the third year of a six-year longitudinal data collection on economic outcomes for sponsored members and their families. The evaluation includes both quantitative and qualitative data and follows families from the time they begin the program. Finally, various project (community) level evaluations are ongoing and led by program staff in each country. The primary purpose of evaluations at the project level is to ensure continuous program improvements and adaptation is to the ever-changing world around the program. For example, an evaluation conducted in Santa Ana, El Salvador, in 2016 has led to an increased focus on the empowerment of mother's participating in small groups to increase their self-perception as leaders. A 2016 evaluation in Quezon, Philippines, was conducted to learn the value of a nutritional program so that the project may gradually phase out the food assistance aspect of their program in flavor of other benefits without negatively impacting families. A 2016 evaluation in Kampala, Uganda, found that 70 percent of members of small groups participated in saving within their group. Sixty-eight percent of the evaluation respondents stated their motivation for saving was to secure their finances for the future. Feedback from sponsors Unbound recognizes sponsors and other benefactors not merely as donors but, first and foremost, as highly valued and respected members of the Unbound community. At Unbound, we believe that both is ponsors and sponsored persons have something to gain from the sponsorship relationship, and toward that end we are committed to helping sponsors become more aware of the realities of global poverty and grow in human solidarity. Education support provided by Unbound's service-schol arship program helps talented older students who, because of economic circumstances, are s truggling to continue their educations. The program is based on the principles of persever ance, leadership and service to the community. The service-scholarship program complements the educational support provided by the Unbound sponsorship program, with 48 percent of scholarship students also sponsored. Unbound scholarships have helped students in communities around the world achieve their educational goals. Students are able to complete their educations, follow their chosen career paths and be of service to the larger community. Scholarships are used for needs such as secondary, post-secondary and vocational school tuition, transportation, school supplies and books. Recipients are selected by local program st affs based on economic need, commitment to completing their educations, demonstrated leade riship potential and interest in community service. Scholars participate in service project is as a requirement of the program. Scholarships are intended as supplemental assistance, and students and their families contribute what they can toward educational costs. In 2016, scholarship grants to Unbound field offices totaled more than \$3 million. Scholarships we re awarded to 7,979 students in Bolivia, Colombia, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, Ecu ador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, India, Kenya, Madagascar, Mexico, Nicaragua, Peru, the Philippines, Tanzania, Uganda and Venezuela. While the contexts of groups are dramatically different, with different geographies and significant cultural differences, it he similarities between the outcomes strengthen the argument for what might be Unbound's contribution through the scholarship and sponsorship programs. Alumni participating in the qualitative evaluation in the Philippines, on average three years out of the program, were pursuing careers from teaching to nursing and accounting to architectural design. One benefit of the ripple-effect-mapping method, over separate evalu ations of each outcome domain, is that we can see far more clearly that there are links be tween the physical and psycho-social-spiritual development. This makes an excellent case for the personalized attention, program activities and relationships that complement tangib le sponsorship benefits. These components can also be called benefits. "The beauty is that each family can choose what is needed in each moment," said one participant in Guatemala. Each individual tells a vastly different story, but all are united in their experience with Unbound. So, while these experiences do force us to recognize the significant influence in the lives of individuals, they also emphasize the remarkable flex ibility of the Unbound program. It has the potential to contribute to an individual's path out of poverty in ways unlike a standard aid-distribution or community-based development approach.
