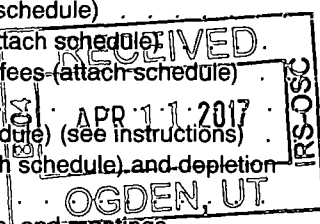

MISSION STATEMENT

Kathleen L. Morrison, a life-long Illinois resident, through her trust document, established the Kathleen L. Morrison Charitable Foundation. The purpose of the charitable trust is two-fold. The first purpose shall be the support of not-for-profit corporations dedicated to the care and protection of neglected and abandoned animals, including but not limited to cats, dogs, household pets, and farm animals. The Kathleen L. Morrison Foundation shall support not-for-profits dedicated to the care of the aforementioned animals located in Illinois and in states other than the state of Illinois as long as their mission and purpose is consistent with the care and protection of neglected and abandoned animals.

The second purpose shall be the support of not-for-profits providing neglected and abandoned children a healthy environment in the creation of homes, either group homes or foster care; Kathleen's Foundation shall support education for socially and economically deprived youth; it shall support and assist institutions of learning providing scholarships to students, otherwise unable to pay for their pre-school, grade school, high school and/or university. Schools dedicated to such youth will emphasize language arts, science, and math, as well as extracurricular activities in athletic disciplines and in the performing and fine arts. Kathleen's Foundation shall also support education in technical schools which provide "training-to-work" programs for young adults and for single parents.
