The visibility of cultural arts in the Haigler area has not in the past been strong The Haigler Community Foundation is trying to be the leader in changing this. This was the first Spring DundyRoo Festival. It was most successful, and will become an annual event. On site educational demonstrations and displays, food, drink, & entertainment, free admission with donations to the Foundation appreciated. This seems to generate more donations than charging an admission fee for our events. Over 40 talented artists and 35 crafters (included students from schools/colleges) were on site. Attendance for the day was over 300, and included people of all ages. We are working with the Nebraska Arts Council for a matching grant for the 2016 event, continuing to enhance and enrich the cultural offerings in our communities for our diverse population. 
