OMCI is involved in multiple health fairs, medical seminars and other community outreach activities that involve screenings, questionnaires and general conversation that help us understand the needs of groups and individuals. The OMCI Community Advisory Council meets on a regular basis, and participants represent a diverse community. In 2015, OMCI conducted its second formal assessment of the health of the communities we serve. With the help of VVW Research and Development, OMCI conducted a community health needs assessment for our primary service area (southwest Johnson and Miami Counties). This was done by performing research and collecting health data for our area, and actively seeking input from the community through an online survey and town hall meetings. This CHNA was approved by the board in November 2015. The research, survey and town hall meetings helped develop a clearer picture of the health-related priorities of residents in our service area. Below are the top four health need priorities in the primary service area for OMCI Health Need Priorities 2017-2019-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Increase awareness of and access to multi-lingual healthcare services and culturally competent healthcare providers. 2. Improve access to behavioral health services, including case management, diagnostic services, overcoming stigma, funding and placement. 3. Decrease the obesity rate in our community by changing healthy eating and physical activity behaviors through interactive education, access and policy. 4. Increase access to affordable care. <p>In 2014, OMCI began implementation of its first Community Health Improvement Plan. To address obesity, OMCI partnered with the Olathe School District to introduce families with young children to the Fitastic Program, which teaches healthy habits such as limited screen time and appropriate servings of fruits and vegetables. The goal for 2014 was to provide information to 50 percent of the elementary schools in the OMCI service area with Fitastic program information. In 2015, the goal was to provide information to 75 percent of the elementary schools in the OMCI service area, which expanded the Fitastic program to the DeSoto school district. In 2016, the goal was to complete distribution of Fitastic materials to remaining schools in the primary service area. That goal was not met due to staffing limitations and capacity. This will remain an additional effort for the 2017-2019 Community Health Improvement Plan. OMCI also utilized its primary care clinics to integrate healthy behavior goals into pediatric patients' electronic medical records. This goal of having 45% of pediatric patients ages 5 to 18 years old was not able to be tracked accurately due to the restrictions of the current electronic medical record. In 2016, OMCI updated its goal to track the number of pediatric patients receiving nutritional counseling. By the end of 2016, 66 percent of pediatric patients received this counseling. Other initiatives addressing this goal included partnering with the City of Olathe to support the community garden program. In 2016, OMCI continued to support community events that had a focus on physical activity including the Olathe Medical Center Women's Triathlon and Garmin Marathons Kids Fun Run. During the course of this plan, OMCI also partnered with Johnson County Park and Recreation to build an outdoor fitness park at Heritage Park. The fitness park is open 24/7 and free of charge to use. The second main initiative for OMCI was access to care and mental health. In 2014, OMCI partnered with the Olathe Fire Department to create a program for individuals who would call 911 or go to the emergency room for non-emergent reasons. This program involves a non-emergency, mobile integrated health vehicle responding to non-emergency situations and follow up with people who are unlikely to comply with physician instructions. OMCI helped the fire department formalize the process for this program in 2014 and also makes an annual significant monetary donation to cover the salary of the nurse practitioner providing this care. In 2015, this program reached 3,000 individuals. In 2016, OMCI continued to financially support this program, which reached approximately 2,090 patients. OMCI also addressed this need by increasing access to behavioral health resources at its outpatient clinics. In 2015, OMCI added a licensed psychologist who works with people of all ages at one of its primary care clinics. OMCI also identified other partners in care for inpatients suffering from mental illness and are continuing to work with those partners to finalize a partnership agreement for inpatient services. In 2016, OMCI began a partnership with KVC Health Systems to provide inpatient psychiatric consults for patients in the hospital. Another focus for OMCI to increase access to care for uninsured/underinsured is</p>

In 2016, OMCI continued its contract with Resolute Group for on-site services to patients and community members who qualify for potential Affordable Care Act options. OMCI also utilized additional efforts to increase access to care and address mental health through its involvement with the Olathe Latino Coalition, Title 1 elementary schools within the Olathe School District and the Health Partnership Clinic. To enhance senior services, OMCI opened a new free-standing inpatient hospice house on its campus in late 2014. The house met a large need in the community for hospice care, as there was no option for the residents within OMCI's primary service area for inpatient hospice services. In 2015, the hospice facility provided care for more than 320 patients. In 2016, OMCI reached its goal by caring for more than 28 patients per month on average. OMCI is also supporting expansion of Cedar Lake Village, a partnership with the Evangelical Lutheran Good Samaritan Society, a senior living retirement community with multiple levels of care. In 2016, the memory care neighborhood began seeing patients suffering from Alzheimers and dementia. OMCI has also incorporated changes within the hospital to better care for seniors, including those with memory care needs, including a senior-friendly emergency room and dementia kits on the nursing units.</p>
