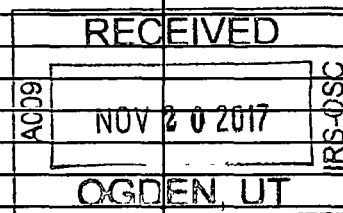

ELECTION UNDER REGULATIONS §53.4942(a)-3(d)(2) TO TREAT EXCESS QUALIFYING DISTRIBUTIONS AS DISTRIBUTIONS FOR PRIOR YEARS

During 2017, the Officers of the Lienonefung Foundation (Taxpayer) identified concerning transactions. Accordingly, after a period of research and consultation with advisors, the Taxpayer made full and prompt correction of past Self-Dealing and Under-Distribution amounts. These transactions occurred due to a reasonable cause. No IRS penalties have been assessed, nor have notices been received on these matters, which the taxpayer voluntarily brings to the attention of the Service on Forms 990-PF and 4720.

For all prior years, the taxpayer acted in a prudent manner by relying on the advice of a professional CPA regarding (1) whether certain expenses were allowable, and (2) whether the operations of the Foundation were properly classified as "Operating" activities. The CPA was later charged with tax evasion due to similar transactions in his own foundation, and subsequently lost his license.

The taxpayer retained a new accountant, DZH Phillips LLP, to calculate the required repayments and distributions. Those payments and distributions have been made prior to filing this return. The details of the reimbursement to the Lienonefung Foundation and additional charitable distributions are noted below. Going forward, the taxpayer will file as a grant-making foundation.

There was no intent to commit fraud, and the taxpayer has fully corrected the matters prior to filing this return. Additionally, abatement of any penalty or additional tax is not prejudicial to the government. For these reasons, we respectfully request waiver of any additional taxes, penalties and interest due to a Reasonable Cause as provided in Reg §301.6651-1.

During the tax years 2012 through 2015, the prior tax preparer erroneously reported expenses in the amount of \$48,295.00 which should have been disallowed. \$10,225 similar expenditures were made during 2016, when the Taxpayer continued to rely on the advice of the same CPA and prior to learning of the error. Upon realizing the miscategorization of allowable expenses, the officers made substantial effort to find a new tax advisor and immediately repaid the organization in full prior to filing this return.

The current preparer, DZH Phillips LLP, reviewed the records and identified expenses in the amount of \$58,520 requiring reimbursement by the officers. The expense detail is in the attached Adjusting Journal Entries report. The officers repaid the foundation in full prior to October 31, 2017.
