The range of centralized services provided by THR include information services, managed care contracting, Human resources, revenue cycle, billing and collections, patient access/admissions, legal, tax, compliance, supply chain, quality, business development, insurance, treasury, marketing, general accounting, real estate services, coding, transcription and strategic planning. In addition, THR does daily cash sweeps of all controlled tax exempt entity cash accounts. As a result, THR has numerous daily transactions with controlled tax exempt entities, none of which fall within the scope of IRC Section 512(b)(13). A management fee is charged for the centralized services and reported on Form 990, Part VII, Section B as a professional services fee. Transactions with related tax exempt organizations falling within the meaning of centralized services as described above, are not listed on Schedule R, Part V, Line 2.
