The California Medical Association (CMA) is a non-profit corporation formed to promote the science and art of medicine, the protection of public health, and the betterment of the medical profession.

CMA worked to pass the most expansive package of tobacco reform legislation in the history of the Golden State, including bills that closed loopholes in workplace and school campus smoking laws, brought e-cigarettes under the umbrella of tobacco products, increased licensing fees, and raised the legal purchasing age to 21. CMA also helped to secure a much-needed investment in our state's primary care workforce: a \$100 million appropriation in the 2016-17 state budget. This appropriation will provide \$33 million each year for three years to increase funding for the Song-Brown Program, a competitive grant program that supports primary care residency programs in medically underserved areas.

CMA once again protected patients from undertrained practitioners looking to offer treatment outside of their scope of practice. Nurse practitioners, optometrists, naturopathic doctors and certified nurse midwives all had their scope expansion effort bills decisively defeated

4c (Code:) (Expenses \$ including grants of \$) (Revenue \$)
The California Medical Association (CMA) legal team was instrumental in securing a victory for physicians in the state's highest court to hold California's health plans liable when they negligently delegate payment responsibility to weak risk-bearing organizations (Centinela- Freeman Emergency Medical Services v. Health Net of California et al.). CMA also filed an amicus brief and raised financial support for the medical staff at Tulare Regional Medical Center in its lawsuit against the hospital alleging violations of state laws when the hospital terminated the entire medical staff and its duly elected officers. CMA's Center for Economic Services also recouped over \$2 million from payors on behalf of members for claims that would have gone unpaid without CMA intervention. That brings the total to \$14 million over the past eight years
