THE COMMUNITY NEEDS SCORE IS A COMPOSITE VALUE DERIVED FROM SCORES ON THE FOLLOWING FIVE PERCEIVED BARRIERS TO HEALTH STATUS: INCOME BARRIER, CULTURAL BARRIER, EDUCATION BARRIER, INSURANCE BARRIER AND HOUSING BARRIER.
