

Our he alth outreach and education services are critically important in the diverse, economically challenged neighborhoods surrounding our hospitals. Among Pennsylvania's full-service safety-net providers, Temple Un iversity Hospital (TUH) serves the greatest volume and highest percentage of patients cove red by Medicaid. We delivered about 2,650 babies, of whom 88% were covered by Medicaid. Temple physicians also staff important clinics that address major public health concerns, such as the Comprehensive Neuroaids Center at Temple University, which is dedicated to improving the public health impact of bench-to clinic research associated with HIV-induced neurological diseases and cognitive disorders. As indicated in the 2016 Community Health Needs Assessment of the Philadelphia Department of Health, poverty, and poor living conditions are prevalent in the City's Lower North and North planning districts served by TUH, in which 46% of the population live at incomes below 10.0% of the Federal Poverty Level, and conditions of living and housing are suboptimal, illustrated by rat complaints of 20-42/10,000 population. Annual budget of \$1.6 billion and more than 8,000 employees make us one of the largest academic medical centers in region. This produces additional economic impact by stimulating the growth of indirect jobs and business in the local community and region. (Estimated \$2.9 billion total economic impact within Pennsylvania supporting nearly 16,000 direct and indirect jobs.)
