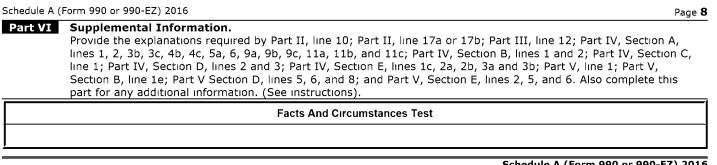

HSHS hospitals are proactively addressing these and other needs through patient, provider and community education, preventative screenings, self-management classes, and new or enhanced clinical services. In FY2017, HSHS collectively provided 5197 6 million in Community Benefit (9.2 % of total hospital expenses). This amount included \$26 omlilion provided for Financial A sistance (a ka Chanty Care) and \$128.6 million for unreimbursed care provided as part of the Medicaid program In addition, HSHS hospitals so community benefit programs, HSHS continues to reinvest any surplus revenue from operations and investments into environmental services of the Medicare program - in excess of governmental and managed care contract payments - was \$205.9 million. HSHS hospitals also recorded \$40.9

One-hundred percent of our clients saw a primary care provider and 54% were econnected to a medical home. This program is being replicated in a second location in Sa ngamon County's eastside where our most vulnerable, low-income and underserved populations exist. Through the support of HSHS. St. Mary's Hospital Medical Center and St. Vincent Hospital in Green Bay, the Oral Health Partnership (OHP) continues to expand to communities throughout Brown County, providing dental care to 0 - 19 year olds who are uninsured or und erinsured. In PY2017, more than 12,000 general dentistry procedures, including exams, X-ra ys, cleanings, fillings, and crowns, were completed for youth in Brown County's smaller, I ess urban communities, and more than 1,300 preventative sealants were applied. OHP serves more than 9,000 kids each year through three fixed-site clinics and the traveling school-based program. In January 2017, OHP's West location was opened in response to data showing an unmet need of medical assistance children in the Ashwaubenon area. This clinic, along with the traveling school-based team, will help OHP and HSHS reach the goal of expanding services to a wider population of Brown County children in need. HSHS St. Francis Hospital in Litchfield, Illinois collaborated with Lewis & Clark Co


