Page 2, Part III - Line 31, Other Program Services

Description

Line 28) For more than 20 years, Hardee County Farm Bureau holds an Ag-Fest for local 4th grade students. This year's Ag Fest had 28 interactive stations, including cattle, citrus, beekeeping, fertilizers, nurseries, and local agricultural businesses. The event serves to educate young people about agriculture in their county. We also provide teachers with Ag-in-the Classroom materials to help educate the students throughout the year on the importance of agriculture.

Line 29) The Young Farmers and Ranchers committee members worked in conjunction with the local Extension Agent and 4-H students on a raised bed garden box project. Students who wanted to raise vegetables were provided with garden boxes, built by the YF&R members, soil, and supplies. The participants learned different lessons throughout the project. One of those lessons was about germination periods and time management as a lot of them had to replant radishes because they were ready to be harvested half way through the 8 week long project. Participants were judged on best yield and best record book. Vegetable gardening can benefit 4-H families by: teaching them responsibility, time management, providing them with an activity that connects them with nature and they can also show citizenship by donating the fruits of their labor.

Line 30) Hardee County participated in Ag Literacy Day. This annual reading event is a chance for farmers, ranchers, University of Florida IFAS extension and 4-H agents and master gardeners, FFA teachers and students and agriculture industry representatives to go into elementary classrooms and read a children's non-fiction book about Florida's agriculture. This year's book was titled Drive Through Florida: Aquaculture and Seafood. Students gain an appreciation of the diversity Florida agriculture offers on a local and state level.
