The Foundation's primary method to do this is to raise funds in support of Mills-Peninsula Health Services, a related 501(C)(3) hospital. In 2017, community support made it possible for the Foundation to purchase numerous pieces of capital equipment to better serve our patients. Some of the equipment purchased includes a Tissue Ablation System for the Surgery Department which is a specialized Ultrasound system used for Neuro Craniotomy procedures. This system offers increased patient safety during these types of procedures. An Electronic Fetal Monitor Upgrade for the Family Birth Center which allows laboring mothers to be mobile and not bedridden or restricted to sitting in a chair. Being ambulant can potentially reduce the cesarean section rate. Our philanthropic community also helped fund Cataract Microscopes for Surgery which are used for advanced eye procedures such as corneal transplants, cataract removal and retinal procedures. Other notable equipment includes two new, state-of-the-art GE Logic E9 ultrasound units for the Women's Center which deliver high resolution images for enhanced identification of suspicious tissue and which provides fewer false positives, an AIM Video Imaging System for Surgery which reduces surgical errors by visualizing vessels, blood flow and tissue perfusion, and major extra-hepatic bile ducts, and an ENT Microscope which is designed for intuitive control and offers significantly improved visualization of the cranial sinuses during surgery. With philanthropic funds we were also able to provide a Jackson Spine Table which provides advanced technology for optimal spinal surgery positioning. The table helps reduce venous clots, minimizes epidural venous bleeding and dramatically improves surgeon visualization. Additionally, we purchased an Ultrasound Breast Unit which provides enhanced images allowing for early detection and diagnosis of breast cancer. Funding was also provided to support screenings for the underserved in our community as well as help our Senior Focus medical day program. Mills Peninsula Hospital Foundation continues to support Mills Peninsula Medical Center with other new equipment in its new hospital which opened its doors in May 2011.
