

Funds raised by Global Banjara Baptist Ministries International support Christian education and outreach carried out by Global Banjara Baptist Ministries (GBBM) in Hyderabad, India. GBBM's activities in 2017 are summarized as follows.

I. School Project - Aletheia Banjara School

Vision Statement

To develop passionate leaders who are adequately equipped academically, socially, physically, and spiritually to influence the world for Christ.

Mission Statement

Aletheia Banjara School offers Christ-centered education in a nurturing atmosphere which enables its students to develop their talents to their fullest potential for service in all areas of God's Kingdom. We know that every individual student is a unique image bearer of God, and we don't let any of them fall through the cracks. Our students thrive here both in classroom and many extra-curricular activities.

Aletheia Banjara School (ABS) is a landmark in Gurrapu Thanda and was inaugurated in July 2009. Pastor K. Srinivas Naik was born in Gurrapu Thanda where there was no school. He had to go to a school far away from his house. Pastor Naik was a recipient of a Government Merit Scholarship, which enabled him to join a reputed Government Residential School in Hyderabad. He successfully completed 10th Grade. He desired to become an engineer after completing the Pre-University Course. During his study, Pastor Naik met with a Christian family who supported his studies and introduced him to church and ultimately lead him to accept Jesus Christ and become a Christian.

Pastor Naik did not forget his past and fellow-Banjara children who neither had proper education nor were aware of the truth that Jesus Christ is the savior. The

Banjara were engrossed in weird superstitions and animistic beliefs. They were illiterate, nomadic tribes, very backward and economically weak. He realized that it is all because of lack of education that the community remained down-trodden. Pastor Srinivas Naik's association with Global Banjara Baptist Ministries (GBBM) helped him draw their attention to this remote village. GBBM felt that education would be a powerful tool for the economic and social uplift of the community, and more importantly it would enable them to reason and to understand the Gospel. With a clear vision from God, and unflinching faith in Him, GBBM laid the foundation stone for its first school on 4 Dec 2005 at Gurrapu Thanda.

ABS has successfully completed eight academic years and is in the middle of its ninth year. The School has introduced many unique features for its students, which no other school in the district has. These are apart from the regular activities that a school should have. Let us briefly discuss some of these features.

ABS Students' performance in 10th Grade Examinations

The first batch of nine 10th grade students appeared for Government Examination in March 2017 and their performance was excellent. All of the students scored highest marks among the students from 15 schools in three counties. The government officials have specifically called the Principal of ABS and felicitated him and acknowledged the performance of the students.

The school continued in 2017 to encourage education for girls; emphasizing English; taking high school students on educational tours; conducting science fairs; conducting competitions in literary activities; teaching students how to maintain health and hygiene; providing safe drinking water, providing a power-packed drink at 10:00 AM & nutritious mid-day meal for lunch; mentoring through Character Building Classes; promoting eco-friendly environment by planting thousands of trees in the locality; observed Indian Republic Day, Independence Day, Teachers Day, Children's Day, Christmas Day and many other special days.

Praise God for plentiful water

Rainfall in this drought-prone region is insufficient and the last four years have been dry. Two bore-wells in the School have dried up. Another bore-well was yielding very little water, which was insufficient and we even had to close the School for a short duration due to water scarcity.

We thank the Lord for a generous donor from Fellowship Bible Church, Waco, TX, who donated sufficient funds for digging another well, which yielded plenty of water to meet all needs of the School.

Boarding facilities

At present, we have 100 boarders in the School. They are being accommodated in classrooms and sleeping on the floors.

During the last two academic years nearly 300 students left the School due to lack of boarding facilities. It was a sad moment for both students and the parents to leave the School. Due to continuous drought in the region, parents of the students were constrained to put their children in boarding schools in order to migrate to other places in search of livelihood.

To arrest this trend, ABS would like to provide boarding facilities to at least 200 students.

ABS is looking for donors to provide ninety 2-tier cots (beds) and 200 mattresses.

Construction of Teachers' Quarters

An amount of \$20,000 was granted against the Water Melon Project for construction of Teachers' Quarters at ABS in 2016.

We have laid the roof for the first floor for four sleeping quarters.

We still need \$30,000 to complete the construction of the first floor.

We needed to finish construction of the floor by March 2018 to attract new teachers to join ABS.

Visit of GBBMI Team in October 2017

We are thankful to Mr Willie Gomez, President, GBBMI for leading a team consisting of Mr. Benny Cherry, Board Member; Rev. Rick Pinner and Ms. Sarah Pinner of Open Range Cowboy Church, Whitney, TX; Mr. Thomas Aguilar of Fellowship Bible Church, Waco, TX; and Ms Sarah Crawford of Killeen, TX to Aletheia Banjara School from 10-16 Oct 2017.

GBBMI President & Team have helped in diagnosing the areas which needed help; taking photos of every student present; taking video footage for Website use; encouraging GBBM India Team; creating excitement among the students; and touching the hearts of believers with spirit-filled sermons.

II. Health

Medical & Awareness Camps were conducted in several regions where GBBM is active in ministry. HIV/AIDS awareness campaigns helped many victims to get treatment and counseling. Sixty-eight (68) individuals are receiving regular medicines for HIV/AIDS, four HIV positive children were admitted in a special boarding school meant only for such candidates.

III. Farmers Training

Mr. C. V. Abraham, one of the Board Members of GBBM India, has been a great blessing to the small and uneducated farmers.

IV. Church Planting:

As in the past few years, the Global Banjara Baptist Ministries' (GBBM) efforts to win souls from the Banjara Community is becoming more and more challenging. The present government is craftily enacting laws to decimate Christianity. To appease the majority religious communities towards polarization for political gains, the authorities in power are supporting fanatic groups. The Indian populace is so polarized now that it is becoming very difficult to publicly preach the Gospel.

The uncertain and hostile environment is making it very difficult for GBBM to achieve its goals. The pastors and evangelists, having tasted the joy and the benefits of salvation, are continuously witnessing to the Banjara and others. The events in various parts of the country are very disturbing. Even the media is gagged and the news of attacks on Christians have literally disappeared from the TV, newspapers, and e-media, etc. The present situation is very disheartening and creating terror and immense fear among the pastors and evangelists and dissuading them not to venture into areas where the Gospel is yet to spread. The incidents of brutal and continuous attacks on Christians in many parts of India, especially Odisha, and forcefully reconverting the hitherto converted Christians to Hinduism is deterring those who are willing to accept Jesus as their personal savior. They are afraid that someday even they will have to face such hostile situations. We commend the GBBM evangelists and Church planters who bravely are upholding Jesus Christ and spreading the Gospel to the unreached in spite of untoward situations. The results may not be great, but hard work and efforts against the vehement opposition is noteworthy.

GBBM's work is based upon four principles: Reaching (sowing the seed); Discipling (help to follow Christ); Leading (equipping/training); and Transforming (encouraging to reach others).

Reaching: GBBM works amongst Banjara Community in four states of India: Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh. The Banjara people are very conservative and inhabit remote villages called thandas. They give a lot of prominence to their religion, religious customs and culture, and perform their religious festivals fervently and with zeal. GBBM pastors and believers and their families too inhabit these thandas and frequently face threats and attacks.

The Government is extending sops, such as free education, government jobs, and hostel/boarding facilities to students, etc., to Schedule Tribes, which includes the

Banjara Community, as well. In a few, states if anyone becomes a Christian, he/she tends to lose these benefits.

These are the major hurdles that the GBBM is experiencing in all Banjara villages. It should be taken into consideration that our pastors work under these adverse conditions where it is not easy to convince a non-believer to accept Gospel. But these circumstances do not deter our pastors to shirk their responsibilities of spreading the Word.

Part III, line 28 (continued):

GBBM work is spread in 195 villages. 31,478 persons heard the Gospel and 866 have accepted Christ as their personal Savior. This we consider a major achievement under the present political situation and concerted efforts of the anti-Christian elements who time and time disturb and discourage the Banjaras from knowing the truth.

Discipleship: Banjara are very sensitive and religious people. Religion had always been a bone of contention and they never allowed anyone to interfere and influence them with regard to religion and religious practices. Open preaching of the Gospel is met with opposition and attracted physical attacks. A better way of communicating with them is the 'man-to-man' approach. Even this approach is met with suspicion and resistance, but to some extent is successful. Some of the believers who accepted Jesus Christ are baptized and trained to become disciples. When the Banjara believers come to know the truth they become very staunch Christians and strive to share their salvation experience with others. These disciples leave everything that they possess and take up the cross. GBBM has many such disciples who reach out to the Banjara Community and win souls. One hundred and forty four (144) believers have been baptized.

Leading: The literacy rate among the Banjara is very low. Many of our believers cannot read or write. Those believers who are literate are picked up and trained to share the Gospel and help in worship services. GBBM recruited Harvest Church of

Memphis, Tennessee and Kingdom's Harvest International (KHI) to help train the pastors, evangelists and church planters. A brief report is given under the heading "On-going Training for Pastors and Leaders".

Transforming: GBBM has a wonderful plan of shaping a believer into a 'fisherman'. The three steps (reaching, discipleship and leading) leads to transforming. It is a painstaking effort to change a believer into a 'fisherman', i.e., a fisher of men. GBBM has been very successful in this aspect and there are many dedicated and sincere servants of God who involve' a believer and help him/her take steps to reach this level.

V. On-going Training for Rural Leaders

GBBM is striving to equip the pastors, evangelists, Church planters and leaders of numerous village churches with various levels of training and imparting practical knowledge to them. Harvest Church of Memphis is sending three teams a year to help in this area. Kingdom's Harvest International (KHI) and few other individuals also are helping GBBM in the training.

Teams and individuals who visited India during the reporting period

(1) From On-His Path, Iowa, Dr. John Mitchell, Dr. Matthew Prihoda and Mr. Todd Baldrige (c/o Pastor Jim Fleming of Collierville, Tennessee), visited us in Hyderabad on 31 Jan 2017. They were supposed to visit the School and a couple of villages to help children with clubfoot, but due to security concerns caused by President Donald Trump's Visa policy towards some Muslim countries during that week, they left for the US two days early. On-His Path has helped us to start five bi-vocational projects in the past.

(2) Dr. Kennon Vaughn, Lead Pastor and Founder of DOWNLINE, Rev. Bill Garner and Team from Harvest Church visited in Feb 2017 and addressed a special gathering in connection with the Inaugural Ceremony of the 15th Anniversary of GBBM. Nearly 700 people from four states attended this meeting. The impact of the Word shared by Dr.'

Kennon Vaughn is still talked about by the participating pastors. The Word of God touched many and changed their lives.
