PART IX-A Summary of Direct Charitable Activities

1) Learning and evaluation: Activities to learn from and communicate grantmaking results.

One of the Foundation's guiding principles is to "be a learning organization interested in measuring outcomes, communicating results, and diffusing successful ideas for implementation throughout New York State and beyond." These learning and evaluation activities increase the impact of the Foundation's grantmaking. Foundation staff develop grant outcome reports to capture and share the lessons of nearly every grant awarded and maintain a vibrant website to disseminate these lessons. The Foundation launched a newly redesigned website in 2017 to enhance the user experience and share information in more engaging ways that meet users' needs. Staff also spend time developing and shaping policy analyses and reports on key topics affecting New York's health system. In 2017, the Foundation expanded its internal capacity to produce these types of materials with the addition of new staff focused exclusively on policy and research.

2) Leverage: Activities to raise funds and create partnerships with other organizations to increase the ability of grantees to improve the health of New Yorkers.

A key strategy for the Foundation is to attract and leverage public and private funds to complement and amplify its own grant dollars. In 2016, NYSHHealth leveraged more than \$20 million in external funding through 33 of its own grants. As one example, NYSHHealth has supported Field & Fork Network in Buffalo to expand participation in Double Up Food Bucks, a food-purchasing program that offers Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients a matching value on dollars spent at farmers markets on fresh, locally grown produce program. In 2017, the Foundation worked with the Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation, John R. Oishei Foundation, Univera Healthcare, First Niagara Foundation, and others to secure additional support for the initiative. In the area of consumer empowerment, NYSHHealth provided support for the development of an online consumer tool to help New Yorkers make informed health care decisions. To complement that investment, the New York Community Trust has agreed to fund a Spanish-language version of the tool. And in the area of improving veterans' health, NYSHHealth worked with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to co-fund a project with the RAND Corporation to assess the impact of the Affordable Care Act on veterans' health insurance coverage and health care.

3) Outreach and education: Activities to convene key stakeholders and educate the media, policymakers, and other audiences about important health care trends and issues affecting New Yorkers and the New York health system.

Foundation staff regularly reach out to the media and respond to requests from reporters to inform their stories on pressing health issues; write blog posts, journal articles, and opinion pieces; share news and information via e-mail blasts and social media; and deliver speeches and presentations at meetings and conferences. The Foundation also serves as a convener of key players in New York's health system. In 2017, the Foundation hosted dozens of convenings, from small, invitation-only discussions, to its "A Conversation With..." series (which brings together leaders in the field of health care to discuss issues pertinent to the Foundation's work), to large conferences attracting hundreds of attendees. The two largest convenings, each attended by approximately 400 people, were: (1) a summit on population health (attended by approximately 400 people), co-hosted with the New York Academy of Medicine and New York University, focused on effective collaboration between health care and other sectors to advance population health and (2) a conference on empowering health care consumers, which focused on the themes of increasing health care information transparency and engaging patients as partners.
