

The Better Lives purpose is to assist people and organizations that help impoverished children to be healthy, receive an empowering education and grow up trained for a job in an expanding local economy so that they can ultimately earn an income and support and guide a happy and healthy family of their own.

The Transrural Trust project supports a holistic approach to community development. The project has included collaborating with the Tamku Village Development Committee (VDC), representing homesteads scattered on a hill between two valleys in the Sangkhuwasabha district. The plan has been to help grow the local nettle fiber cottage industry, so that it can become an income-generating engine that could eventually contribute funds towards paying for children’s education and providing critical community services.

Transrural’s aim is to demonstrate how a modest injection of external aid over a period of up to 10 years, when targeted accurately and combined with strong local participation and leadership, can result in sustainable improvements in the lives of very poor people. The organization aims to complete the implementation phase of our program by the end of 2017, and thereafter monitor and provide ad hoc support at arms-length.
