THE SJH CAFETERIA BEGAN DONATING ITS FOOD SURPLUS TO SENIOR SUPPORT SERVICES TO HELP FEED HUNDREDS OF HOMELESS AND VULNERABLE SENIORS. OVER 4,000 LBS OF PREPARED FOOD HAS BEEN DONATED IN 2017. HEALTH PRIORITIES NOT ADDRESSED BY THE CURRENT CHIPS: SAINT JOSEPH HOSPITAL (SJH) RECOGNIZES THAT THE OTHER HEALTH NEEDS AND INDICATORS IDENTIFIED IN THE 2015 SJH COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT ARE IMPORTANT FOR THE HOSPITAL AND THE COMMUNITIES IT SERVES. NUMEROUS OTHER ORGANIZATIONS ARE CONCURRENTLY ADDRESSING MANY OF THESE REMAINING NEEDS.
