**Part IX-A Line 3 - Summary of Direct Charitable
Activities**

Desai Sethi Foundation (DSF) acquired a two-story building in late 2017 in the Midtown neighborhood of Detroit, exclusively to execute a number of initiatives to help members of underprivileged local communities and to accelerate the growth of the overall ecosystem that will continue to serve these underprivileged communities in the Detroit area, as well as other similar communities across the country. The proposed initiatives given below will be started as soon as building renovation is complete.

- DSF to host "office hours" twice a week for 3 hours where it offers resume development, skill development, interview techniques and job search assistance for those interested in pursuing social enterprise or technology-related careers or career transitions. DSF will bring in career coaches and counselors to provide top quality services.
- Social enterprise: DSF has designed a curriculum to teach young adults from the local community about various concepts related to technology and entrepreneurship and the social sector with the help of teachers, professionals in related fields, and our own staff.
- Social enterprise hackathon: Designed to bring together young adults from the local community with professionals and experts in technology, entrepreneurship and design thinking to identify some of the most pressing problems in these communities, and design technology-based solutions to address them with the coaching and mentorship provided by our staff, volunteers and hired moderators. The winning ideas have an opportunity to receive a grant to continue working on its development.
- Nonprofit leadership community and workspace: DSF to use part of its space as a workplace and community for early-stage nonprofit social enterprise organizations, whose products and services benefit underserved local communities. DSF to provide office space, tangible, in-kind resources including legal, finance, and development talent, coaching and mentoring for development of soft skills.
- Through the builder program, DSF will be creating technology-enabled social enterprises that design products or services that directly benefit at-need, underserved populations. DSF will conceive the ideas for these nonprofit organizations, validate them in the market, hire a staff to build and execute, and fully fund the cost of the organization for several years.
