The Committee as part of its analysis obtains from the compensation consultant appropriate comparability data including total compensation paid by similarly situated for-profit and non-profit health care organizations for positions that are functionally comparable to each of the Executives. With respect to those Executives below the level of Chair/Chief Executive Officer, the Committee requests that the Chair/Chief Executive Officer work with the compensation consultant to formulate a compensation recommendation for each such Executive, consistent with VMHSs compensation philosophy and principles. The Committee approves total compensation packages for each of the Executives based on information presented to the Committee, reasonableness and the best interests of the Medical Center. The Committees decisions regarding compensation for each Executive are documented in written resolutions and minutes of the Committee The Committee promptly reports its action to the Board whose reports are reflected in the Boards minutes. The Executives that were reviewed in 2017 were Chief Executive Officer, President, Chief Financial Officer, Senior Vice Presidents, Vice Presidents, Physician Chiefs, Clinic Medical Director, Hospital Medical Director, and
