The training is very comprehensive and includes over 50 individual break-out sessions.A comprehensive survey of attendees is completed to measure the effectiveness of the training.Translation services are available for hispanic families, as well as signing for those with hearing impairments.The events generally have 450 in attendance and trainers from all over the US and Canada.**4b** (Code: BW) (Expenses \$ 24,136 including grants of \$) (Revenue \$ 66,791)(Expenses exclude indirect general overhead costs. Revenue is program fee revenue only and does not include voluntary donations.)The only direct fund raising component relating to auction is included separately under general fund raising revenue.Buddy Walk Program is used under license from DSS, and the program is focused on community awareness and advocacy.An opportunity for families and individuals to collect as a group and participate in a walk and outdoor recreation.Speakers address many topic related to disabilities, and other programs of NW Disability Support are shared with families.This is an outside venue event and various members of the community come together to support individuals with disabilities.A secondary focus is the ability to sponsor teens on the website, but the event is not primarily a fundraising event.**4c** (Code: BF) (Expenses \$ 17,739 including grants of \$) (Revenue \$ 26,739)Bike First is an event that provides special training with state of the art technology that helps teach young people with disabilities how to ride a bike in a safe and effective manor. It is held at a local university and has both paid and volunteer staff. The program is well received and is supported by many donations. It fits well with the overall goal of helping individuals with a disability become physically capable and build confidence.
