North County refers to the area west and north of Gaviota and includes the Lompoc, Santa Maria, Santa Ynez and Cuyama valleys. South Coast refers to the Goleta, Santa Barbara, and Carpinteria coastal plain. Santa Barbara County's approximate 440,000 population is divided into six sub regions. Santa Barbara/Goleta Region, Santa Ynez Valley, Carpinteria Valley, Lompoc Valley, Santa Maria Valley, Guadalupe Valley, and the Cuyama Valley. Of the total population, approximately 50% are females.
