- 3 the funds will be expended for the preservation and maintenance of a **217** acre nature park that is open to the public (i e for the “charitable” purpose of preserving lands for public use or scientific enjoyment) within the meaning of section 170(c)(2)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code,
- 4 the amount expended by the grantee towards accomplishment of those purposes is **\$3,870,000** (based on the most recent report received from the grantee),
