AUSTIN HEALTH CENTER (HJAHC) IS A FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTER (FQHC) IN THE CITY OF TRENTON AND THE LARGEST NON-HOSPITAL BASED AMBULATORY CARE PROVIDER IN THE CITY. PRIMARY HEALTH CARE SERVICES INCLUDE ADULT MEDICINE, GYNECOLOGY, PEDIATRICS, HIV TREATMENT, DENTAL CARE, PODIATRY, AND OPHTHALMOLOGY. ADDITIONAL SERVICES ARE NUTRITION, SOCIAL SERVICE, SUBSTANCE ABUSE ASSESSMENT AND INTERVENTION, BEHAVIORAL HEALTH, TRANSLATION SERVICES, TRANSPORTATION, AND AN ONSITE PHARMACY. MOST FORMS OF HEALTH INSURANCE INCLUDING MEDICARE AND MEDICAID ARE ACCEPTED, AND THERE IS A SLIDING FEE SCALE FOR THE UNINSURED. HJAHC PROVIDES CARE TO APPROXIMATELY 13,000 INDIVIDUALS ANNUALLY GENERATING MORE THAN 50,000 VISITS FROM FOUR LOCATIONS. SFMC TRENTON COLLABORATES WITH HJAHC IN AREAS OF DIABETES AND NUTRITION.</p>
