All three counties lag the state average in terms of individuals with a bachelor's degree or higher (28.9%). The rate of Williams County residents with a bachelor's degree or higher trails the state average by more than six percentage points, with Divide County trailing by more than nine percentage points, and McKenzie County trailing the state average by almost four percentage points. High school graduation rates tend to be closer to the state average. The educational backgrounds of area residents can affect a health care facility's ab ility to find qualified staff members. This grant would have offered varying levels of addiction services locally and through technology in cooperation with the Foundation's center in Bismarck. The grant application was completed and submitted by Holly Snellings, Director, Williams County Social Services. Applications were reviewed at the end of September and the beginning of October. Inexplicably, our community was not chosen. We planned to share leaders to support the community coalition in implementing the Heartview program if selected, and provide hospital and clinic resources to ensure the success of the program.
