For the purposes of this CHNA, we defined vulnerable community members as those who are uninsured, underinsured, have low or no incomes, have chronic conditions, are elderly, who face housing and/or food instability, those who don't speak English well or at all, and/or face particular challenges when attempting to access the health care system. In the CHNA, we identified our top health priorities to address over a three-year period. These were increase access to care and health services for low- and no-income patients, reduce preventable re-admissions and emergency department re-encounters, increase access to and awareness of breast and lung cancer programming, and reduce preventable instances of heart disease, hypertension and stroke. Priorities were chosen based on the number of persons affected, the seriousness of the issue, whether the health need affected vulnerable populations, and availability of community and hospital resources to address the need. The Piedmont Hospital Board of Directors ratified the CHNA on May 17, 2016. The FY18 Piedmont Hospital implementation strategy was developed in partnership with hospital leadership and community stakeholders to address the identified priorities listed in the FY16 community health needs assessment. 
