Page 2, Part III - Line 31, Other Program ServicesDescription

Line 28) Lafayette sponsored AgVenture Day for 100 elementary school students. We incorporated stations which focused on the importance of agricultural education. We included forestry, corn, poultry, dairy, beef, cotton, and peanuts. A mechanical cow provided a unique learning experience on proper milking techniques. Students received hands-on experience and learned the importance of agriculture and farming on a local, state, and national level.

Line 29) Lafayette county is involved in several programs throughout the school year to educate students and cultivate an appreciation for agriculture. Farm Tours allow students to observe first-hand the processes involved in producing various foods such as milk and cane syrup. Students visited a local dairy farm where they learned how to milk a cow and observed the process of cane grinding.

Line 30) A Lafayette elementary school teacher received a mini-grant which allowed students to learn about the importance of recycling and how it relates to agriculture. Students recycled food scraps (vegetables) and other organic materials, such as leaves and small wood scraps, to make compost for a flower garden maintained at their school. Students tracked and graphed the results of which plants would grow faster; plants with worm composted material, plain composted material or regular soil with no compost.
