As the largest not-for-profit health care system in Texas and one of the largest in the United States, BSWH was born from the 2013 combination of Baylor Health Care System and Scott & White Healthcare Today, BSWH includes 50 hospitals, over 1,100 patient care sites, more than 7.500 active physicians, approximately 48,000 employees and the Scott & White Health Plan BSW Temple is one of the system's two flagship hospitals and provides inpatient and outpatient medical services to treat individuals with diseases, illnesses and injuries of varying complexities. Services include providing patients with innovative methods of prevention, diagnosis, treatment, education and support consistent with a quality teaching and research hospital. Multidisciplinary interaction among physicians helps ensure comprehensive care for all stages of illness through all stages of life. Many of the major health care programs have received national recognition and honors, including the Level I Trauma Center and Neonatal Intensive Care Unit During the fiscal year, BSW Temple admitted 33,274 patients resulting in 164,486 patient days, delivered 2,497 babies, and received 74,300 emergency department visits. Baylor Scott & White McLane Children's Medical Center admitted 3.263 patients resulting in 11.576 patient days, and received 28.527 emergency department visits. 
