AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS
OF
BONFILS-STANTON FOUNDATION
Amended January 17, 2018

ARTICLE I

Office

1. Principal Office. The principal office of the Foundation shall be located in the City of Denver, State of Colorado.
2. Registered Office and Agent. The Foundation shall continuously maintain in Colorado a registered agent and a registered office.

ARTICLE II

Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees shall consist of distinguished citizens of the State of Colorado who shall be selected from a wide diversity of backgrounds so as to enhance the governance of a substantial charitable foundation.

1. General Powers. Subject to limitations contained in the Foundation's articles of incorporation (the "Articles"), all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under authority of, and the business and affairs of the Foundation shall be managed and controlled by the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees may formulate a Statement of Policy to be used as a guide in the administration of the affairs of the Foundation. Said Statement of Policy and any changes therein shall be approved by the Board of Trustees in the manner set forth in the Articles.
2. Number and Terms. The number of Trustees, including the Community Trustees (described in Section 3 below), shall not be less than three nor more than nine. The term of office of each Trustee shall be three years, and Trustee terms will be staggered so that only

approximately one-third of the terms expire each year. At each annual meeting of the Board of Trustees, the number of Trustees equal to the number whose term expires at the end of such meeting shall be elected by the Board of Trustees, to hold office until the end of the third succeeding annual meeting. Each Trustee shall hold office until such trustee's term expires and thereafter until such trustee's successor has been duly elected or appointed and qualified, or until such trustee's earlier death, resignation or removal. No Trustee may serve as a Trustee for more than three consecutive terms; provided, however, Community Trustees shall serve only one term.

3. Community Trustees. As described further in the Foundation's Community Trustee Policy, as it may be amended from time to time, the Board of Trustees may elect up to two trustees (the "Community Trustees") whose term of office shall be three years, and no Community Trustee shall serve more than one term. A Community Trustee is not eligible to serve as an officer of the Foundation or as a committee chair. Except as provided in this Section 3, a Community Trustee is considered a Trustee for all purposes of these bylaws and the Articles.

4. Removal of Trustees. Any Trustee may be removed, with or without cause, by the vote of a three-fourths majority of the Trustees then in office.

5. Resignation. Any Trustee may resign at any time by providing written notice of resignation to the Chairman of the Board or the President and CEO of the Foundation, and any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein or if no time is specified, then at the next meeting of the Board of Trustees.

6. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Trustees shall be filled by a majority vote of the remaining Trustees. A Trustee elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of the Trustee's predecessor in office.

ARTICLE III

Meetings of the Board

1. Annual Meeting. An annual meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be held in October or on such other date as shall be determined by a majority of the Trustees.
2. Other Regular Meetings. Other regular meetings shall be held on a quarterly basis on dates determined by the Board of Trustees.
3. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Trustees may be called at any time by the Chairman of the Board or by any three members of the Board of Trustees.
4. Participation in Meetings. In an unusual or unavoidable circumstance, a Trustee may participate in a regular or special meeting through the use of any means of communication by which all Trustees participating may hear each other during the meeting. A Trustee, or Trustees, participating in a meeting by this means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.
5. Notice of Meetings. Written notice stating the place, date and hour of the meeting shall be delivered not less than ten (10) days nor more than thirty (30) days before the date of the meeting either personally, by US mail, or by electronic mail, by or at the direction of the Chairman of the Board or the other Trustees calling the meetings.

Neither the business to be transacted at nor the purpose of any regular or special meeting of the Board of Trustees need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting unless specifically required by statute, by the Articles or by these bylaws.

Any Trustee may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a Trustee at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting except where a Trustee attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the

meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

6. Quorum. A majority of the Trustees then in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The act of the majority of Trustees present at a meeting in which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Trustees unless otherwise specified by statute, by the Articles or by these bylaws. If less than a majority of Trustees are present at the meeting as called, such meeting may be adjourned and such adjourned meeting may be reconvened without further notice. When such adjourned meeting shall consist of a quorum, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at a meeting as originally called. A quorum once having been present at any meeting or adjourned meeting, the Trustees may continue to transact business until adjournment, notwithstanding the withdrawal of Trustees to the extent that the number present shall be less than a quorum.

7. Voting. Each Trustee shall be entitled to one vote on any matter that comes before the meeting.

8. Presumption of Assent. A Trustee of the Foundation who is present at a meeting of the Board of Trustees at which action is taken on any corporate matter shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless the Trustee's dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting or unless the Trustee shall file a written dissent to such action with the person acting as the Secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof or shall forward such dissent by registered mail to the Secretary of the Foundation within forty-eight hours after the adjournment of such meeting. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a Trustee who voted in favor of such action.

9. Action Without a Meeting.

(a) Any action required or permitted to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Trustees

may be taken without a meeting if a notice meeting the requirements of Section 9(b) (the "Notice") is transmitted in writing to each Trustee and each Trustee by the time stated in the Notice either: (i) votes in writing for such action, or (ii) (A) votes in writing against such action, abstains in writing from voting, or fails to respond or vote, and (B) fails to demand in writing that action not be taken without a meeting.

(b) The Notice must state: (i) the action to be taken, (ii) the time by which a Trustee must respond, (iii) that failure to respond by the time stated in the Notice will have the same effect as abstaining in writing by the time stated in the Notice and failing to demand in writing by the time stated in the Notice that action not be taken without a meeting, and (iv) any other matters the Foundation determines to include.

(c) Action is taken under this Section 9 only if, at the end of the time stated in the Notice: (i) the affirmative votes in writing for such action received by the Foundation and not revoked pursuant to Section 9 equal or exceed the minimum number of votes that would be necessary to take such action at a meeting at which all of the Trustees then in office were present and voted, and (ii) the Foundation has not received a written demand by a Trustee that such action not be taken without a meeting (other than a demand that has been revoked pursuant to Section 9(e)). Unless the Notice states a different effective date, action taken pursuant to this Section 9 shall be effective at the end of the time stated in the Notice.

(d) A Trustee's right to demand that action not be taken without a meeting shall be deemed to have been waived unless the Foundation receives such demand from the Trustee in writing by the time stated in the Notice and such demand has not been revoked pursuant to Section 9.

(e) Any Trustee who in writing has voted, abstained, or demanded action not be taken

without a meeting pursuant to this Section 9 may revoke such vote, abstention, or demand in writing received by the Foundation by the time stated in the Notice.

(f) Any writing by a Trustee under this Section 9 shall be in a form sufficient to inform the Foundation of the identity of the Trustee, the vote, abstention, demand, or revocation of the Trustee, and the proposed action to which such vote, abstention, demand, or revocation relates. All communications under this Section 9 may be transmitted or received by the Foundation by electronically transmitted facsimile, e-mail, or other form of wire or wireless communication.

(g) Action taken pursuant to this Section 9 has the same effect as action taken at a meeting of Trustees and may be described as such in any document. All writings made pursuant to this Section 9 shall be filed with the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors.

10. Committees. The Board of Trustees by resolution adopted by a majority of the Trustees may designate and appoint one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more Trustees together with such other persons as the Board of Trustees may designate, which committees, to the extent provided in the resolution, shall have all the authority of the Board of Trustees, except as prohibited by the Articles or by any statute.

11. Standing Committees. There shall be four standing committees consisting of an Investment Committee, Audit Committee, Nominating and Governance Committee, and Executive Committee. Members shall be Trustees and may include up to two (2) non-board members each of which shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Board. In no instance, shall non-board members exceed Trustees on a Standing Committee, and non-board members shall not serve on the Executive Committee.

(a) The Investment Committee shall consist of from three (3) to four (4) members as

determined from time to time by the Chairman of the Board, and shall oversee the investments of the Foundation and shall make over-all investment policy recommendations to the Board of Trustees. The Investment Committee shall also be responsible for the selection of investment managers and the transfer of investments between funds subject to the over-all policies adopted by the Board of Trustees, provided that any such action does not involve more than Ten Million Dollars, and provided also that the President and CEO of the Foundation has approved the action. The Investment Committee shall meet at least quarterly on a schedule to be adopted by the Committee.

(b) The Audit Committee shall consist of from three (3) to four (4) members as determined from time to time by the Chairman of the Board. The Audit Committee shall meet at least annually directly with the outside auditors of the Foundation and out of the presence of the President and CEO and his or her subordinate officers to review the financial situation of the Foundation and to receive any comments or criticisms which the outside auditors deem appropriate for presentation to the Board of Trustees.

(c) The Nominating and Governance Committee shall consist of from three (3) to four (4) members, one of which shall be the President and CEO of the Foundation. The Nominating and Governance Committee is responsible for: (i) developing the Board of Trustees through nomination, orientation, and ongoing education of board members; (ii) recommending governance policies to the Board of Trustees and assuring adherence to the Foundation's governance policies; and (iii) such other duties as are delegated to the Nominating and Governance Committee by the Board of Trustees.

(d) The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the Board, the Vice Chair of the Board, and the Chairs of the Investment Committee, the Audit Committee, and the

Nominating and Governance Committee. The Executive Committee will be Chaired by the Chairman of the Board. The Executive Committee shall meet at least annually during the first quarterly meeting of each new fiscal year or at a time determined by the Chair, to conduct an annual review of the performance of the President and CEO.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

1. Officers. The officers of the Foundation shall be a Chairman of the Board, a Vice Chair of the Board, a President and CEO, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The Board of Trustees may appoint such other officers, managers, or agents as the business of the Foundation may require, including one or more Assistant Treasurers, and one or more Assistant Secretaries, each of whom shall hold office for such period, have such authority and perform such duties as are provided in these bylaws or as the Board of Trustees may from time to time determine. The Board of Trustees also may engage the service of management consultants, legal counsel, accountants, auditors and other professionally qualified persons to serve at the pleasure of the Board of Trustees to assist in conducting the administrative functions of the Foundation and to perform such other duties as may be directed by the Board of Trustees.

2. Election, Qualification and Term of Office. All officers shall be elected annually by the Board of Trustees at its annual meeting. The Chairman of the Board and the Vice Chair of the Board shall be members of the Board. The Secretary and the Treasurer may, or may not, be members of the Board, at the discretion of the Board. One person may hold more than one office, except that one person shall in no event hold both the offices of President and CEO and Secretary. Vacancies may be filled or new offices created and filled at any meeting of the Board of Trustees. Each officer shall hold office until a successor shall have been duly elected and

shall have qualified, or until such officer's earlier death, resignation or removal. Any officer may be removed by a vote of a majority of the Trustees at any meeting of the Board whenever in their judgment the best interests of the Foundation will be served thereby. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board of Trustees or to the Secretary of the Foundation. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein; and, unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

3. Authority and Duties of Officers. The officers of the Foundation shall have the authority and shall exercise the powers and perform the duties specified below and as may be additionally specified by the President and CEO, the Board of Trustees or these bylaws, except that in any event each officer shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be required by law.

A. Chairman of the Board: The Chairman of the Board shall be a member of the Board of Trustees, and shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees. The Chairman shall also be a non-voting ex-officio member of all standing committees of the Board. The Chairman shall have and perform duties incident to the office of the Chairman of the Board and such other functions which may be assigned by the Board of Trustees.

B. Vice Chair of the Board: The Vice Chair of the Board shall be a member of the Board of Trustees, and shall assist the Chairman of the Board and perform such duties as may be assigned by the Chairman of the Board or by the Board of Trustees. The Vice Chair of the Board shall, at the request of the Chairman of the Board, or in the Chairman's absence or inability or refusal to act, perform the duties of the Chairman and when so acting shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions on the Chairman.

C. President and CEO: The President and CEO shall be the chief executive officer of the Foundation. The President and CEO shall have general supervision over the business and affairs of the Foundation and its several officers, with the exception of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees. The President and CEO may sign and execute, in the name of the Foundation, deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, and other instruments which have been approved by the Board of Trustees, or as to which the Board has delegated to the President and CEO the authority to approve or disapprove thereof. The Board shall also have authority to delegate to some other officer or agent the right to execute any such documents on behalf of the Foundation. The President and CEO shall also perform in general all duties incident to the office of the chief executive officer of the Foundation and such other duties as may from time to time be assigned by the Board of Trustees. The President and CEO shall also prescribe the duties for officers and employees of the Foundation whose duties are not otherwise defined. Checks drawn on the Foundation's accounts in excess of \$100,000 shall require the signatures of either the President and CEO or the Treasurer and the Chairman of the Board. The President and CEO shall not enter into any agreement which binds the Foundation to any service in an amount in excess of \$200,000 or for a period longer than three years, without the express approval of the Board of Trustees. The President and CEO shall keep the Board of Trustees informed of all space leases, all extensive remodeling contracts, and all long-term consulting agreements. The President and CEO shall not make any changes in the Foundation's investments without Investment Committee approval, and if the amount involved is in excess of Ten Million Dollars, the approval of the full Board of Trustees shall be required. Finally, the President and CEO shall not sell or dispose of any tangible personal property of the Foundation with a value of \$100,000 or more without Board approval.

D. Secretary: The Secretary shall be responsible for the recording and distribution of the minutes of all meetings of the Board of Trustees. The Secretary may delegate to an assistant secretary the recording of the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Trustees. The Secretary shall keep a register of the mailing addresses of each Trustee, and shall see to it that all notices of Trustees' meetings, whether regular or special, are duly served. The Secretary shall certify and keep at the principal office of the Foundation the original or a copy of its bylaws, as amended or otherwise altered to date, and a book of minutes of all Trustees' meetings, with the time and place of holding, whether regular or special, how authorized, the notices thereof given, and the names of those present at the meetings. The Secretary shall be custodian of the corporate records of the Foundation and see that the books, reports, statements, and all other documents and records required by law are properly kept and filed; exhibit at all reasonable times to any Trustee, upon application, the bylaws and minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Trustees of the Foundation; and in general perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary, and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to the Secretary by the President and CEO or by the Board of Trustees.

E. Treasurer: If required by the Board of Trustees, the Treasurer may give a bond for the faithful discharge of the Treasurer's duties, in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Trustees shall determine. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of, and be responsible for, all funds and securities of the Foundation, receive and give receipts for monies due and payable to the Foundation from any source whatsoever, and deposit all such monies in the name of the Foundation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected by the Board of Trustees; keep and maintain adequate and correct accounts of the Foundation's properties and business transactions, including amount of its assets, liabilities,

receipts, disbursements, gains and losses; exhibit at all reasonable times the books of account and records to any Trustee during business hours at the office of the Foundation where such books and records are kept; render a statement of the condition of the finances of the Foundation at all meetings of the Board of Trustees, and a full financial report at the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees; pay all lawful obligations of the Foundation; and in general perform all the duties as from time to time may be assigned to the Treasurer by the President and CEO or the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE V

Contracts, Checks, Deposits and Funds

1. Contracts. The Board of Trustees may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Foundation, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Foundation and to bind the Foundation by any contract or to pledge its credit or to render it liable pecuniarily for any purpose in any amount.

2. Checks, Drafts, Etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes, acceptances or other evidence of indebtedness issued in the name of the Foundation, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Foundation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Trustees. Endorsements for deposit to the credit of the Foundation in any of its duly authorized depositories may be made with countersignature, by the President and CEO, or the Treasurer or any other officer or agent of the Foundation to whom the Board of Trustees, by resolution, shall have delegated such power, or by hand-stamped impression in the name of the Foundation.

3. Deposits. All funds of the Foundation shall be deposited to the credit of the Foundation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Trustees may

select.

4. Gifts. The Board of Trustees may accept on behalf of the Foundation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Foundation.

ARTICLE VI

Indemnification of Officers and Trustees

1. Scope of Indemnification. The Foundation shall indemnify Trustees of the Foundation pursuant to the procedures set forth in, and to the fullest extent authorized by, Colorado law. The right to indemnification provided herein shall be a contract right and shall include the right to be paid by the Foundation in accordance with Colorado law for expenses incurred in advance of any proceeding's final disposition. The Foundation may indemnify officers, employees and agents of the Foundation to the same extent as is permitted for directors under Colorado law (and to a greater extent if consistent with law). No such indemnification shall be made without the prior approval of the Board of Trustees, however, and the determination of the Board of Trustees that such indemnification is permissible. The Foundation may maintain insurance, at its expense, to protect itself and any Trustee, officer, employee or agent of the Foundation against any expense, liability or loss whether or not the Foundation would have the power to indemnify such person against such expense, liability or loss under Colorado law. The foregoing rights of indemnification shall not be exclusive of other rights to which any Trustee, officer, employee or agent may be entitled as a matter of law.

2. Savings Clause; Limitation. If any provision of the Colorado Revised Nonprofit Corporation Act (the "Act") or these bylaws dealing with indemnification shall be invalidated by any court on any ground, then the Foundation shall nevertheless indemnify each party otherwise

entitled to indemnification hereunder to the fullest extent permitted by law or any applicable provision of the Act or these bylaws that shall not have been invalidated. Notwithstanding any other provision of these bylaws, the Foundation shall neither indemnify any person nor purchase any insurance in any manner or to any extent that would jeopardize or be inconsistent with the qualification of the Foundation as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or that would result in the imposition of any liability under section 4941 of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE VII

General Standards of Conduct for Trustees and Officers

1. Discharge of Duties. Each Trustee shall discharge the Trustee's duties as a trustee, including the Trustee's duties as a member of a committee of the Board, and each officer with discretionary authority shall discharge the officer's duties under that authority (i) in good faith; (ii) with the care an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would exercise under similar circumstances; and (iii) in a manner the Trustee or officer reasonably believes to be in the best interests of the Foundation.

2. Conflict of Interest. Each Trustee shall annually sign and agree to comply with the Conflict of Interest Policy approved by the Board, as it may be amended from time to time.

3. Reliance on Information, Reports, Etc. In discharging duties, a Trustee or officer is entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, if prepared or presented by: (i) one or more officers or employees of the Foundation whom the Trustee or officer reasonably believes to be reliable and competent in the matters presented; (ii) legal counsel, a public accountant or another person as to matters the Trustee or officer reasonably believes are within such person's professional or expert

competence; or a committee of the Board of Trustees of which the Trustee is not a member if the Trustee reasonably believes the committee merits confidence. A Trustee or officer is not acting in good faith if the Trustee or officer has knowledge concerning the matter in question that makes reliance otherwise permitted by this Article VII unwarranted.

4. Liability to Foundation. A Trustee or officer shall not be liable as such to the Foundation for any action taken or omitted to be taken as a Trustee or officer, as the case may be, if, in connection with such action or omission, the Trustee or officer performed the duties of the position in compliance with this Article VII.

5. Trustee Not Deemed to Be a "Trustee." A Trustee, regardless of title, shall not be deemed to be a "trustee" within the meaning given that term by trust law with respect to the Foundation or with respect to any property held or administered by the Foundation including, without limitation, property that may be subject to restrictions imposed by the donor or transferor of such property.

6. Loans to Trustees and Officers Prohibited. No loans shall be made by the Foundation to any of its Trustees or officers. Any Trustee or officer who assents or participates in the making of any such loan shall be liable to the Foundation for the amount of such loan until the repayment thereof.

ARTICLE VIII

Miscellaneous

1. The fiscal year of the Foundation shall begin on the first day of July of each year and shall end upon the last day of the following June.

2. References to Internal Revenue Code. All references in these bylaws to provisions of the Internal Revenue Code are to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of

1986, as amended, and to the corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

ARTICLE IX

Amendment of Bylaws

These bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed and new bylaws adopted by the affirmative vote of three-quarters of the Board of Trustees at any regular meeting of the Board or at any special meeting of the Board. The notice of such meetings shall include the statement that one of the purposes of the meeting is to consider an amendment to the bylaws.
