The most recent review was completed in August 2017. The resulting report is provided to the Board and Management for review. The CEO is responsible for hiring the remainder of the Hospital's executive team and for using comparable data studies to set their salaries.

The compensation is not based directly on the Hospital's overall revenue, but rather on the individual charges that are generated by the Physician.
