However, this diversity is not equally spread throughout the region and tends to be concentrated in the urban core. The Pioneer Valley Transit Authority, the second largest public transit system in the state, serves 11 communities in the service area and connects suburban areas to the core cities and services. Paratransit service is also available for people with disabilities within 3/4 mile of a fixed route to facilitate access to medical care. Economically, the Baystate Medical Center service area is home to many of the largest employers in the region as well as numerous
