### Part IX-A - Summary of Direct Charitable Activities

Since its inception in 2000, the Highmark Foundation has made a lasting impact in the communities Highmark served by taking the steps necessary to improve the overall health and well-being of its residents. Throughout 2018, the Foundation continued to stand behind its mission of improving the health, well-being, and quality of life for individuals and communities by awarding a series of grants, sponsorships and educational support, totaling \$2.7 million. Since 2000, the Foundation has awarded over \$120 million to charitable organizations, schools and hospitals across Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

The Highmark Foundation has three key funding categories in place for its grant making efforts

- · Chronic Disease
- Family Health
- Service Delivery Systems

The Foundation's history is its unparalleled dedication to improving children's health throughout the region. For almost 20 years the Foundation has served as a catalyst and thought leader in addressing the childhood obesity and bullying epidemic facing our region and, ultimately, our nation and still remains an integral part of the Foundation's work. The Foundation has issued Request for Proposals to build the capacity in non-profits to serve more women veterans. The Foundation has also supported health-related efforts such as HPV cancer free campaign, Hepatitis C program, a women's behavioral health conference and an initiative to expand the blood donor base and awareness campaign to promote the importance of blood donation.

In addition, the Highmark Foundation approaches grant making proactively, engaging the health care community and utilizing research to identify areas of need in which Foundation funding will make a profound difference. The Foundation has also created urgency around many public health issues facing the region. It is achieving its mission by funding strategic and evidence-based health care initiatives that educate, protect and ultimately improve the overall well-being of the large population it serves and has a three-pronged approach to its work.

- Public Health
- Systems Change
- Thought Leadership

This approach compliments the Foundation funding categories (mentioned above) as it seeks to support programs that reach vulnerable or at-risk individuals such as those who are uninsured, underserved, Medicaid and Medicare populations. These programs include pilot projects, model programs, illustrations of the effectiveness of early intervention and preventive health programs, incorporate sound programmatic methods and evaluations as building blocks for long-term program success and stimulate the efficient use of scarce health resources through cooperative planning and program initiatives which encourage cross-sector collaborations.

### Part XV Line 2b

### **Proposal Process**

The Foundation awards programmatic grants in the area of health to 501(c)(3) organizations. The Foundation defines health broadly to include social, behavioral and other dimensions beyond illness or disease. The grant making process is performed primarily through invited proposals or requests for proposals. The Foundation awards grants in two ways.

- 1 Invited Proposals are target specific audiences and activities identified by the Foundation. Unlike request for proposals (RFPs), these proposals involve the participation of a specific entity and may represent a longer-term commitment from both the grant recipient and the Foundation. All phases of the project must be acceptable to the Foundation prior to funding, including estimated costs, timelines and expected results.
- 2 Request for Proposals will be issued periodically related to specific health topics. Organizations with demonstrated capacity or evidence of strong potential to mount successful projects with respect to the target health topics will be invited to submit a proposal in response to the RFP. A limited number of grants will be awarded based upon a competitive analysis of the proposals submitted. Grants will be awarded to the applicants deemed to be the most responsive to the RFP requirements.

### **Proposal Guidelines**

To respond to an invited proposal, the following information is required

- 1 All applicants must complete the Highmark Foundation online grant application at <a href="https://highmarkfoundation.versaic.com/login">https://highmarkfoundation.versaic.com/login</a> or visit the Highmark Foundation website at www.highmarkfoundation.org
- 2 Organizational overview (history, mission and contact information)
- 3 A brief statement of the problem
- 4 A description of the proposed project, including why it is important, its objectives, the target population(s), qualifications of staff, the impact on the community, project start and completion date and a timeline
- 5 A statement of how the project fits into other work being done in the community, region and/or field
- 6 A description of what constitutes success and how the organization plans to measure it
- 7 A description of how the program outcomes will be communicated to relevant audiences
- 8 The requested amount of funding, an itemized budget of the overall project and an indication of other prospective funding sources
- 9 A detailed evaluation plan that describes measurement tools and administration
- 10 A sustainability plan
- 11 General information, including contact person and telephone number
- 12 A statement declaring that the organization is a public charity as described in sections 501(C)(3) and 509(a)(1),(2) or (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986

Upon receipt and review of the submission, the Highmark Foundation will notify the applicant of the status of the request. If it is determined that the request meets the criteria then it could be considered for funding. If it does not meet the criteria, then the request is declined and notification is sent to the organization.

Part XV Line 2d

The Highmark Foundation makes grants to non-profit organizations throughout the areas served by Highmark Inc., and its subsidiaries and affiliates. The Highmark Foundation has focused its attention on a variety of health issues in 2018 including but not limited to obesity prevention in African American communities, HIV treatment adherence program, cancer prevention, and school based health efforts. In 2018, the Highmark Foundation awarded approximately \$2,680,591 to 106 non-profit organizations for traditional grants and schools through a "Request for Proposals" (RFP) process titled "Creating a Healthy School Environment". The Request for Proposals to schools is issued annually. Schools applying for funding may select from one of four areas.

- Bullying Prevention
- Child Injury Prevention
- Environmental Health
- Healthy Eating and Physical Activity

Highmark Foundation traditional grants are awarded in three priority areas listed below along with examples of grant funded programs

- Chronic Disease Grants funded programs
  - American Cancer Society- to support HPV (human papillomavirus) campaign in partnership with two Federally Qualified Health Centers
  - North Side Christian Health Center- to support the development of an integrated hepatitis C (HCV) virus program
- Family Health Grants funded programs
  - The Children's Home of Pittsburgh- to promote the health and well-being of medically fragile infants and children through services which establish and strengthen the family
  - Jewish Healthcare Foundation- to support Virtual Senior Academy Tech Buddy Program Combatting social isolation, increasing digital literacy among low-income seniors with an innovative web-based program
- Service Delivery Systems Grants funded programs:
  - Blood Science Foundation- to support the Blood Donor Base Expansion Initiative a community awareness campaign to promote the importance of blood donation
  - Centre Volunteers in Medicine- to support a planning grant to assist with developing integrated behavioral health services in the current medical home model of providing routine and emergency medical and dental care, intensive case management and medication support

The Foundation also considers numerous factors in deciding whether to fund a specific proposal, including but not limited to the following criteria.

- · Consistent with the Foundation's goals, strategies and focus.
- Creates models with potential application throughout the Foundation's footprint
- Demonstrates new and sustainable ways to solve health problems
- Reduces long-term cost or duplication of services and resources
- Incorporates sound methods of evaluation for long-term program success
- Improves and assures access to quality health care for underserved populations in urban and rural areas
- Illustrates the effectiveness of early intervention and prevention health programs
- Seeks creative ways to leverage the Foundation's limited dollars
