| | Shelter Operating NeedsFOTAS supplemented the county's shelter budget by funding numerous items for hundreds of shelter |
| | animals. These include medical treatment for 271 heartworm positive dogs which would otherwise prevent their adoption, flea |
| | and tick treatments for hundreds of cats and dogs, and specialty medicines not normally provided for in the annual budget. FOTAS |
| | provided humane tethers to facilitate the shelter's Fido Off the Chain program and dog houses for the Pets in Need program. FOTAS |
| | purchased collars, leashes and toys for shelter animals and funded the enormously successful Dogs Playing for Life Group. This |
| | 5-day a week program helps socialize, exercise and enrich the lives of shelter dogs which in turn increases the live release rate. In |
| | honor of our military, FOTAS paid the fees for veterans and active duty personnel who adopted cats and dogs from the shelter. |

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| 4c | Transfers and FostersDue to overcrowding at the county animal shelter, FOTAS worked aggressively to transport as many adoptable animals as possible to no-kill shelters. The transfer program includes an extensive network of volunteers who foster pets until they are old enough or healthy enough for transport. In 2018 FOTAS organized 102 transfers for a total of 1,304 dogs and cats who could not be adopted in the local community. This program is by far the most successful of our initiatives to increase our live release rate from a dismal 9 percent in 2009 when FOTAS was established to an incredible 90 percent in 2018. We will continue to work hard to keep our save rate over 90 percent so that the county shelter may be classified as a no-kill shelter. In 2018, 4,507 cats and dogs were saved from euthanasia. (Code:) (Expenses \$ 4,131 including grants of \$ 4,131) (Revenue \$ -0-) Spay and Neuter SurgeriesTo reduce the number of unwanted animals turned in to the shelter, the county and FOTAS accelerated our Trap, Neuter and Return to Field program (TNR). More than 1,000 community/feral cats were sterilized at no charge to anyone bringing a cat in for surgery. FOTAS purchased humane traps for the shelter and private citizens to use for TNR. This is also one of our most successful programs to increase the live release rate at the shelter. In previous years, most feral cats were euthanized because they could not be domesticated for adoption. Our TNR program encourages citizens to return the cats to their outdoor homes to live out their lives after their surgeries. This spay and neuter program also reduces the number of unwanted kittens turned in to the shelter requiring socialization and adoption. |
