Students competed for placement on school teams which then competed against each other. The competition has had demonstrable results, raising passing rates on national exams by 5-30%. The 2018 summer enrichment camp for 174 students from 15 schools included instruction in basic computer literacy, English, Haitian arts and crafts and athletics. Health and hygiene instruction included critical lessons on reproductive health and safety from the Days for Girls program. The two-week camp employed 13 local principals and teachers as classroom leaders and 13 local students as counselors and translators. The camp also provided daily hot lunch and potable water. Four U.S. teachers mentored and collaborated with 13 local teachers and principals in a 2-day workshop prior to the start of camp. Through this collaboration with U.S. teaching professionals, 13 Haitian teachers learned new pedagogical methods, instructional planning techniques and classroom management strategies. Interactive classroom materials, books, computers, software, art materials and athletic equipment were also provided for the camp. These materials were donated to local schools and the community library after the camp concluded. The Alliance in 2018 also supported other academic activities, including a community-wide book fair. Line 29: In 2018, the Alliance supported local schools by providing academic resources including textbooks and school supplies to 8 local schools. Through the school garden program, the Alliance also provided training, seeds and materials to create school gardens at 6 elementary schools. In addition, the Alliance provided funding to the local vocational and technical school, enhancing programs in Hospitality and Construction and providing job placement opportunities for local students. Line 30: In 2018 the Student Sponsorship program provided tuition support for 317 students attending 15 primary and secondary schools and 10 post-secondary schools. These sponsorships also provided uniforms, books and supplies as needed. Line 31: Other Program Services provided in 2018 included teacher professional development and support for the local library and computer lab. The Alliance supported 44 teachers at 6 schools through a professional development program led by the Centre D'Apprentissage et De Formation Pour La Transformation (CAFT). The 50- hour training program included curriculum development, school leadership, lesson planning and positive classroom management. Principals also received 2 days of instruction in school management and leadership. Additional teacher training was provided through the summer enrichment camp via a 2-day workshop led by volunteer U.S. teachers in support of 13 local teachers and principals.
