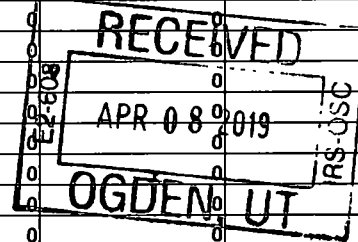

His legacy extended to the hiring practices at Dave's Killer Bread, where 30%+ of our workforce are people with criminal backgrounds. Dave's Killer Bread believes in hiring the best person for the job, regardless of criminal background, and has witnessed firsthand the impact that this has had on employees, the brand, and the community. DKBF was founded with the desire to bring this practice, Second Chance Employment, to other businesses and create even more meaningful change. DKBF is built to inspire, educate, and equip businesses with the motivation and tools they need to implement Second Chance Employment. We are the subject matter expert in this space, connecting HR professionals business owners, other non-profit organizations, and policy makers, as we work to make Second Chance Employment a more common and accepted practice. DKBF has held numerous events and workshops across the country to educate attendees about Second Chance Employment, and dispel some of the common fears and myths around hiring people with criminal backgrounds. We have participated in many events (SHRM, SXSW, ICPA, INC 5000) as guest speakers and panelists to demonstrate the power that Second Chance Employment has on employees, businesses, and communities. We have 3 main components to our organization to accomplish our work: 1) The Second Chance Playbook: this is an online resource that helps to educate interested businesses about what steps they can take to become a Second Chance Employer. It is a series of short videos an assessment, and business coach service to answer any questions and act as a thought partner with employers embracing this philosophy. 2) The Second Chance Ecosystem: this is a network of recruiting partners and wrap-around services in various cities throughout the country that Second Chance Employers work with and point their employees to for assistance to help set them up for success. Examples include housing resources, counseling, and addiction help. 3) The Second Chance Business Coalition: this is the group of employers who already practice, support, and champion Second Chance Employment. The purpose of this group is to create a louder voice for the cause demonstrate strength in numbers and build momentum for even bigger change.
