After a sudden demise from pancreatic cancer of the only working member of this family, a community fund drive project was initiated by HBB to help the helpless members of this family of small children and the stay home mom. In addition to helping their immediate need for livelihood and education, the living parent (mother) is also getting vocational training from this program assistance to enable the ease of acquiring a sustainable career so that the family becomes self sufficient and not become a burden to the society. This project specific donation fund was open and pledges appear to be promising to continue this assistance sometime up to 2019 when the family is expected to be on its feet. At that time the project will be closed by providing the project specific balance to the grantee.

2. Rohingya Refugee Project (\$10k, grantee - Integrated Development Foundation, 18/5 Mirpur, Dhaka, Bangladesh. Project service provides various aspects of health and education of displaced refugees in Bangladesh.

3. One Health Project (\$9.95k, grantee - Model Livestock Advancement Foundation (MLAF), Amulia Model Town, Dhaka-1316, Bangladesh.

This projects service provides training and education to school children and butchers in the poor neighborhood in Dhaka, Bangladesh on some common diseases that are transmit from animal to human and vice versa. It also train participants how make awareness in the community on the health of humans, animals and healthy environment (eco health). Thousands of individuals in the community get the benefit.

4. Thalassemia Project: (\$9.926k, grantee -Institute of Allergy and Clinical Immunology(IACIB), Zinzira Road, Savar, Dhaka-1341, Bangladesh).

Project service includes screening tests for Thalassemia infection among university students and building awareness on the fatal form it.

5. Empowering Women Project: (\$7.853k, grantee - MLAF (see address above), empowering poor and unemployed women providing professional training in health sector (as Nurse Assistant) for employment, self support and self esteem.

6. California Wildfire (Campfire) Victim help Project (\$35.8k, local volunteers distributed approved HBB fund (cash for food and shelters, supplies) to the needy affected families from the city of Paradise which was virtually perished due to called Campfire.

7. Urothoplasty for the poor: A life saving surgical procedure for deformed urinary system and this projects helped supplementing the part of the cost for those who can not afford the cost. Pilot project started in Mymensingh, Bangladesh (grantor -IACIB, see above for address)

8. Winter Drive projects (~\$2k, done local youth volunteers) to help by providing financial assistance or providing supplies including winter clothes, toys etc to foster and deprived children, homeless people in local Sacramento area.
