b Peace Research Grants - The Foundation provides small grants of \$1,000-\$5,000 to support peace research projects in the international peace research community for individuals or organizations. This program benefits a large and diverse number of people internationally in addition to the grant recipient due to the requirement that recipients disseminate the research widely. Four new grants were funded in 2018, of which \$3,000 each was paid to three of the recipients and \$2,730 was paid to the fourth, and four more awardees were paid their final \$2,000 payments. Travel grants of \$10,377.31 were made for past awardees to present their research at the IPRA Peace Studies conference. Other expenses included a wire transfer fees of \$360 and administrative contract labor fees of \$9,310.

FUNDING RESTRICTIONS

All funds must be used for the intended research project. We will only support substantiated expenses directly related to the research project. Budgets that include non-allowed expenses will cause your application and proposal to be rejected. It is your responsibility to make sure your budget only includes allowed items. If you have questions about whether or not an expense is allowable, please ask, but do not ask about any of the non-allowable expenses listed below. Non-allowed budget expenses include, but are not limited to:

- Fees by a third party such as a university to administer your grant

- **2) Project End Date**: The Project Proposal should state the date the project is anticipated to end.
