For all of its patient services, the Medical Center utilizes a comprehensive electronic cost reporting package which uses the directly assigned general ledger costs and allocates all overhead costs to operating costs using a model inspired by the Medicare cost report. This model with the Medical Centers calculation shows a Medicare shortfall of 26 0 million which is not included in the traditional cost report primarily due to shortfall of Medicare professional fees versus costs.
