



# APPLICATION INFORMATION FOR 2019 POSTDOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP & CAREER DEVELOPMENT AWARD PROGRAM

A.P. Giannini, the founder of the Bank of America, established the A.P. Giannini Foundation in 1945 to bring to fruition his long-held dream to promote the study, discovery, treatment and care of diseases that impair the human body. Since its inception, the A.P. Giannini Foundation has awarded over 900 fellowships to postdoctoral biomedical researchers sponsored by California's accredited medical schools. The Foundation expects to fund 8-10 new fellowships in 2019 on a competitive, peer-review basis for a maximum of three years based on satisfactory performance.

The A.P. Giannini Foundation invites physician-scientists and junior researchers with 3-36 months of postdoctoral research experience to apply to the 2019 Postdoctoral Research Fellowship & Career Development Award Program.

The Fellowship and Career Development Award Program supports innovative research in the basic sciences and applied fields and trains fellows to become established investigators and to pursue scientific leadership positions in academia, industry, public and non-traditional career pathways. Research project should advance the translation of biomedical science into treatments, preventions and cures for human diseases.

## ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS

Postdoctoral researchers are eligible to apply to the 2019 program if they have completed no less than 3 months and no more than 3 years in their mentor's laboratory as of <u>December 31, 2018</u>. The starting date of postdoctoral studies should be well documented and easily verifiable. Applicants with tenure-track research positions or faculty appointments are ineligible.

- Applicants must be United States citizens or permanent alien residents. They must hold or complete an MD; MD/PhD; PhD or equivalent degree before they activate the fellowship.
- Applicants must arrange their research training before they apply to the 2019 program. The research training program must be sponsored by an accredited California medical school and performed under the mentorship of a principal investigator who holds a full-time faculty appointment at the sponsoring medical school as the fellow.

## FELLOWSHIP STIPENDS

Fellows receive a competitive stipend for their research training. Stipend payments are sent directly to the sponsoring medical school and can only be used for salary support. No deductions are allowed for benefits, departmental or institutional overhead. The current stipends are \$54,000 in Year 1, \$55,000 in Year 2 and \$56,000 in Year 3.

Candidates may be eligible to obtain additional salary support from their sponsoring institution. They cannot concurrently hold a full fellowship from another source or a federally funded career development award. Other income will not preclude favorable consideration.

## CAREER DEVELOPMENT AWARD

Fellows receive career development training and support to maximize their postdoctoral experience. Fellows are required to attend an annual colloquium for career mentoring and networking and participate in workshops and trainings to foster their communication, leadership and management skills and to strategically navigate their scientific careers.

# TIMELINE FOR APPLICATION SUBMISSION, EVALUATION AND FUNDING

The Foundation must receive the candidate's completed application and letters of reference before 3:00 pm (PT) on Monday, November 5th.

Please note the Foundation will not accept applications postmarked on or after November 5<sup>th</sup> nor consider faxed or emailed applications. All Letters of Reference must be sent to info(a) application info and ation.org.

During December and January the Scientific Advisory Committee evaluates all applications and will notify candidates of their status in the review process by January 21, 2019. The Committee will interview finalists on February 28, 2019 and select the 2019 awardees.

## APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Applicants must use the 2019 Application Form to apply to the 2019 Research Fellowship & Career Development Award Program. They should work with their prospective mentor and grants officer to prepare the application in advance of the deadline to avoid errors and omissions. The 2019 application form and instructions are also available at the website www apprantinfoundation org

## NOTIFICATION TO CANDIDATES

The Foundation will notify candidates by email when their application is complete. Candidates must notify the Foundation if they accept another fellowship at any time during the application and review process (November 5, 2018 – March 1, 2019).

Competition for the A.P. Giannini Postdoctoral Research Fellowship & Career Development Award Program is intense. Less than ten percent of candidates who apply receive awards. The Foundation does not provide successful or unsuccessful candidates with critiques of their applications or their rankings in the review process.

The Scientific Advisory Committee places strong and equal emphasis on evaluating the academic record and potential of the candidate, the scientific innovation and medical significance of the research, the quality and nature of the proposed mentorship and the candidate's plan to develop skills and experience to achieve career advancement.

The Committee emphasizes the following criteria in selecting candidates to interview:

- The originality and the scientific and medical importance of the proposed research.
- The relevance of the research into the treatment, prevention and cure for human diseases.
- The accomplishments of the candidate as demonstrated in peer-reviewed publications and letters of recommendation.
- The commitment of the candidate to a career in biomedical research.
- The commitment of the principal investigator to provide significant and personalized leadership to mentor the candidate and support his/her career development.
- The accomplishments of the principal investigator in the candidate's field of inquiry.

## CONDITIONS OF FELLOWSHIP AWARD

Fellows must comply with the following conditions of the fellowship award:

- Activate the fellowship between April 1 and December 1, 2019.
- Complete at least the first year of the fellowship before accepting another full fellowship.
- Attend the Foundation's annual colloquium and career development workshops.
- Notify the Foundation promptly if plans change and unable to continue the fellowship. The fellowship cannot be transferred to a different institution or mentor.
- Devote at least 80% of time to research. Fellows may include time for clinical work.
- Send the Foundation a brief report at the end of the first, second and third years of the fellowship summarizing the progress of the research project and fellowship experience.
- Acknowledge the support of the A.P. Giannini Foundation in all published papers resulting from the research project and provide the Foundation with one reprint of each publication.

# THE A.P. GIANNINI FOUNDATION POSTDOCTORAL RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP & CAREER DEVELOPMENT AWARD PROGRAM

The A.P. Giannini Foundation has played an important role in science philanthropy since its inception in 1945. The Foundation has distributed nearly \$40 million to fund innovative research that advances the translation of biomedical sciences into treatments, preventions and cures for human diseases. Recent fellowship awards have supported research into heart disease, influenza, leukemia, embryonic development, Parkinson's, ALS and Alzheimer's diseases, autism, immunity and aging and novel therapies to address fertility issues, cystic fibrosis, melanoma, Hepatitis B, diabetes, prostate and lung cancer, kidney disease and follicle reconstitution.

A.P. Giannini fellows are among the most highly respected medical and scientific investigators in their respective fields, and have served as mentors to succeeding generations of young scientists. Fellows have held leadership positions at schools of medicine, the public sector and industry, including: Roche, Gilead, Calico, the National Institutes of Health, White House, U.S. Food and Drug Administration, UCSF, Harvard University and University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, to name a few.

The Foundation recently distributed an electronic survey to 254 fellows to assess their fellowship experiences, satisfactions and career trajectories. Of the 104 responses received, the majority of fellows stated the fellowship provided a unique opportunity to develop their scholarly agenda and played an important role in launching their careers. Follow-up interviews generated opportunities for fellows to "tell the story of their careers" and revealed three main themes:

## The importance of the initial interview experience.

Fellows reflected on the impact that the Foundation interview had on their professional identities, with many suggesting that it was an experience that signified a turning point in their lives.

## The validating effect of the fellowship award.

The fellowship validated the awardees not only in the eyes of their peers but in their self-perception. The award fostered a sense of credibility in their research and confidence in their future; provided freedom to develop a new set of skills in a protected environment; created opportunities to publish and to compete for academic positions; and led to larger awards and federal grants. All fellows indicated the award played a significant role in their career development, even if their careers took unexpected twists.

#### Former fellows would like to participate in a community of A.P. Giannini Fellows.

Many commented they would like to mentor other fellows early in their scientific careers. Consequently, the Foundation launched an annual colloquium to bring together former and current fellows for career mentoring and networking. In addition, the Foundation initiated workshop trainings to foster communication skills, develop leadership skills and help fellows strategically navigate their scientific careers.

The Foundation is governed by a nine member board of Directors, including representatives from the A.P. Giannini family, Bank of America, and biotechnology and health care industry. The Foundation's Scientific Advisory Committee advises the Board of Directors on the quality and competitiveness of fellowship candidates, their research projects and the overall postgraduate research fellowship program. Committee members also identify candidates at their medical schools, review and evaluate fellowship applications and select new fellows each year.

The completed application consists of <u>one</u> copy of the documents listed below. Candidates are responsible to ensure the Foundation receives their three letters of reference and their mentor's letter of recommendation by the November 5, 2018 deadline.

## Three Letters of Reference

The Foundation requires three letters of reference from qualified individuals best able to assess the candidate's potential to conduct meaningful research. The quality and depth of these letters are critical to evaluating the candidate's suitability. Referees <u>must</u> submit letters on their institution's letterhead to <u>info@apgianninifoundation org</u> no later than November 5, 2018. Please do not follow-up with a hard copy.

The candidate's prospective mentor may not serve as one of three referees. Candidates with an MD degree should include a letter from their Residency Chief or Fellowship Director. For candidates with a PhD degree, one of the three referees must be the doctoral thesis advisor.

The following documents should be typed, using standard fonts no smaller than 11-point and sent to the A.P. Giannini Foundation Scientific Advisory Committee, 57 Post Street, Ste. 510, San Francisco, CA 94104:

- (1) The 2019 Postdoctoral Research Fellowship & Career Development Award Application Form


  State the title of your research project and a brief description of the proposed research project that can be understood by the general public.
- (5) Significance of proposed research for non-scientific audience, not to exceed one page
  Explain the practical application of your research beyond the laboratory and the potential to help advance the translation of basic biomedical sciences into new treatments, prevention and cures for human diseases.
- (6) Technical statement of proposed research, not to exceed five single-spaced pages (excluding bibliography)

  Outline the research problem, the hypotheses, methodology, expected results and timeline for the research project.
- (7) Mentor's NIH biosketch
  In addition, include a list of the following: (1) no more than 15 publications relevant to the candidate's research (2) current and pending support for the laboratory and (3) former postdoctoral trainees and their current positions.
- (8) Mentor's Letter of Recommendation (maximum of four pages)

  Provide a detailed, personalized appraisal of the candidate's qualifications and proposed research. Outline the specific mentorship plan to help the candidate further develop his/her scientific career and promote his/her independence.

  Include a brief description of the research facilities and equipment available to the candidate.





# History

Amadeo Peter Glannini was born on May 6, 1870 in San Jose, California. Known affectionately as "A.P.," Glannini was not only an innovator in banking, but also a man with remarkable integrity and extraordinary faith in human character.

The son of Italian immigrants, A P left school at age 13 to work in a wholesale produce business in San Francisco. He retired at 31, married and financially secure. In 1904, A.P. founded the Bank of Italy. From the beginning, he was a unique banker, making loans to immigrants, farmers, small businesses, women and minorities. The bank's loans and deposits quintupled within a year.

In 1909 Giannini began purchasing banks throughout California, converting them into branches of the Bank of Italy By1918 the Bank of Italy had become the first statewide bank in the United States. In 1930 the Bank of Italy was renamed the Bank of America, and would soon become the largest banking institution in the world.

A.P. supported causes he believed in and followed his instincts with memorable results: in 1906, when the great earthquake struck San Francisco, he personally rescued the bank's gold and currency, and his was the first bank to resume operations. When Walt Disney ran \$2 million over budget on Snow White, Giannini loaned the essential funds. And when no other institution would finance the construction of the Golden Gate Bridge, he stepped forward.


A P earned the affection and loyalty of devoted friends, business associates and employees with his warm personality. He had an intense desire to succeed and to enable others to excel. Throughout his life he developed people of outstanding talents, yet remained mindful of the less fortunate. While his public benefactions were legion and well published, many other people quietly benefited from his energy, kind spirit and generosity.

A. P. was committed to promoting the discovery and treatment of human disease. On his 75th birthday, May 6, 1945, he created and endowed the A. P. Giannini Foundation with a personal gift of nearly \$500,000 to support innovative research in the basic sciences and applied fields. Since its inception, the Foundation has provided funding to over 900 postdoctoral biomedical researchers at California's accredited medical schools. Glannini postdoctoral fellows are among the most highly respected medical and scientific investigators in their respective fields, and have served as mentors to succeeding generations of young scientists.

The A.P. Giannini Foundation Invites physician-scientists and Junior researchers with 0-3 years of postdoctoral research experience to apply to the Postdoctoral Research Program. Proposed research should advance the

translation of blomedical science into preventions and cures for human diseases and train fellows to become established investigators.

The Foundation awards six to eight new fellowships annually on a competitive, peer-review basis, and funds fellowships up to a maximum of three years. Recent awards support research in embryonic development, Parkinson's and Alzheimer's diseases, autism, immunity and aging; and novel therapies to address fertility issues, cystic fibrosis, melanoma, Hepatitis B, diabetes and prostate cancer


