SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTHMMS CONTINUES TO WORK WITH PHYSICIANS, HEALTH SYSTEMS, AND PAYERS TO DEVELOP SUSTAINABLE CARE DELIVERY AND PAYMENT MODELS THAT INCORPORATE INNOVATIVE AND CREATIVE WAYS OF IMPROVING THE SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH FOR ALL PATIENTS AND IS EDUCATING HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS ABOUT SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH AND THE IMPORTANCE OF ADDRESSING SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH IN ORDER TO IMPROVE HEALTH OUTCOMES AND PROMOTE HEALTH EQUITY. IN FY19 MMS BECAME THE FIRST STATE MEDICAL SOCIETY TO ADOPT POLICY RECOGNIZING THAT "ENJOYMENT OF THE HIGHEST ATTAINABLE STANDARD OF HEALTH, IN ALL ITS DIMENSIONS, INCLUDING HEALTH CARE, IS A BASIC HUMAN RIGHT."

PHYSICIAN WELL-BEING AND BURNOUTMMS HAS WORKED TO CONVENE RESPECTED PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS TO ADDRESS THE ISSUE OF PHYSICIAN AND HEALTH CARE PROVIDER BURNOUT. THESE ONGOING EFFORTS INCLUDE WORK WITH NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS, HOSPITAL ORGANIZATIONS, HEALTH PLANS AND MEDICAL SCHOOLS TO IDENTIFY AND ADDRESS THE ROOT CAUSES OF BURNOUT AMONG PHYSICIANS AND OTHER PROVIDERS. IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE HARVARD T H CHAN SCHOOL OF PUBLIC HEALTH, THE HARVARD GLOBAL HEALTH INSTITUTE, AND THE MASSACHUSETTS HEALTH AND HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION, THE MMS PUBLISHED AN INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNIZED REPORT IDENTIFYING PHYSICIAN BURNOUT AS A HEALTH CARE CRISIS.

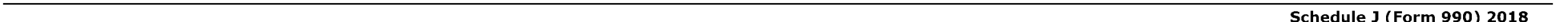
