IN FISCAL YEAR 2019, TRINITY HEALTH INVESTED \$3.7 MILLION IN TCI AND HAS LEVERAGED OVER \$6.5 MILLION IN COMMUNITY MATCH FUNDING TO DATE. IN ADDITION TO THE PROGRAMMATIC SPENDING DESCRIBED ABOVE, THE SYSTEM DEPLOYED NEW AND RENEWED LOANS OF \$5.3 MILLION FOR PLACE-BASED INVESTING TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING, HEALTHY FOODS, EDUCATION, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. 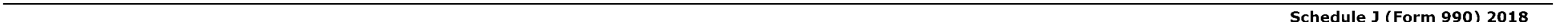
